THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For

the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic

Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. What's Pastor Thinking

Crying babies in church are a good reason to give thanks to God! Who has not felt pain for a parent when their baby lets out a piercing scream

tantrum when everyone is silent. Some people get annoyed, but I thank God. You might think I thank God because I don't have children of my own and don't have to listen to that chorus of screams every day. That's not the reason! When I hear a baby cry in church I thank God because it is a sure sign that our church has a future! For with that baby's scream is the hope that there is a loving parent who is doing their best to pass on the faith to their family. And they do that in the same way the faith was passed on to them - by taking their family to church. If you go into a church that does not have a crying baby, that church is in trouble. It has no future! Today we gaze with Mary and Joseph at the mystery of the baby born in Bethlehem and the plan God has for the future of the world. Shepherds also came to gaze. They actually left their flocks behind! That's highly unusual for shepherds to leave their flocks unattended. So, what was it about this king in diapers that caused them to go to the manger? Well, we could ask the same question of ourselves: what drew us into church today? What caused us to leave our family time, interrupt our busy lives, and

come to St. Aidan? Is it because it's a tradition?
Because that's what we do at Christmas? Hardly, for Christmas is bigger than tradition. It's about finding faith in a God who will never give up on us. Faith leads us to find in the very humanness of the babe in the manger, the mystery of God with us.

EMMANUEL. Mary and Joseph got no Hallmark baby, but a crying infant who kept them up nights for weeks. In choosing to make His entrance in such an ordinary way, God showed us that flesh and blood, dirt and sky, life and death were good enough for Him. This is the true message of Christmas — God loves us so much that he became like one of us. The world has a future! We have a future! That's something worth passing on.

Once again during this Christmas season of 2023, God, through Jesus, reaches out to the core of our very soul, saying: *I came to save YOU, no matter how lowly you may be; and don't you even think that you have to reach up to me, I already came down to you. Just accept my gift of love and salvation.* Let us embrace once again God's great gift of Jesus, in which He proves His love for us once and for all. And let's do all we can to pass this it to others. Make this a very Merry Christmas! And pray for the peace of Jerusalem, Bethlehem and the world. May peace be found in our families and in our nation. Remember and believe, God will never give up on us!

CHRISTMAS WAFERS AVAILABLE IN THE RECTORY OFFICE (\$1)

Christmas wafer is a popular, family-centered Christmas tradition enjoyed by families from Eastern Europe. Each wafer is rectangular in shape with a Christmas image pressed into them, such as the Nativity, the Star of Bethlehem, or the Holy Family. The tradition is observed by families with a Polish, Slovak or Lithuanian background. The word "Bethlehem" means "House of Bread." The breaking of bread has long been a sign of charity, unity, and friendship in many cultures. The Christmas Wafer reminds us of this symbol of communion common to humanity, as well as in a fuller way the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as Christians share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ, the Christmas wafer allows for one's family to come together and share the love they have for one another.

Just before the Christmas Eve meal the entire family will gather around the table with the Christmas wafer. Generally the eldest member of the family, usually the father or mother, will

begin the ritual
by breaking off a
piece of the wafer
and passing it to
another family
member while
giving a blessing.
This blessing can
simply consist of
what you desire
for your loved
one in the



upcoming year - whether it be good health, growth in God's grace, or happiness. It can also be a request for forgiveness and a desire for reconciliation. The Christmas wafer is then passed from person to person around the table until all have had a piece and all have been given blessings. Each person then consumes their piece of the wafer in a special display of love and solidarity between the whole family. The purpose of this act is primarily to celebrate the Christmas spirit: peace, love, joy, and goodwill.

ARE YOU SEARCHING?

Are you searching for a faith to follow? Do you know someone who may be interested in learning more about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches? Were you baptized as an infant but not raised in the faith or raised in another Christian faith? Whatever your situation, wherever you are in your faith journey, OCIA (formally RCIA) is here for YOU. OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. 





- 6. Public schools may not require students to sing Christmas songs whose messages conflict with the students' own religious or nonreligious beliefs.
- 7. Public school students may not be prohibited from distributing literature to fellow students concerning the Christmas holiday or invitations to church Christmas events on the same terms that they would be allowed to distribute other literature that is not related to schoolwork.
- 8. Private citizens or groups may display creches or other Christmas symbols in public parks subject to the same reasonable time, place, and manner restrictions that would apply to other similar displays.
- 9. Government entities may erect and maintain celebrations of the Christmas holiday, such as Christmas trees and Christmas

LITURGY COLUMN

Merry Christmas, and like the song says, may your every wish come true. But perhaps it would be better to say Happy Birthday, because that is what we are really celebrating today, the birthday of Jesus Christ. That's why we have bumper stickers that say "Keep CHRIST in CHRISTmas". And while we receive and give gifts, let us remember that on that first Christmas over two thousand years ago, it was God Who gave us all a great gift. The Son of God, the second member of the Trinity came down to earth as a poor, humble, helpless Baby. Born into poverty, into a working class family, not in a hospital, or even in a nice clean bed, but in a manger, a feed trough for animals. And

who was there to welcome Him? Yes, a choir of angels, which must have been pretty spectacular for the few who saw and heard them. That being, of course, a few shepherds, who at that time were considered sort of second-class citizens, poorly paid and perhaps not fully trustworthy. But biblically, shepherds were important. The first murder victim was a shepherd, Abel, the son of Adam and Eve, slain by his brother, Cain. The greatest king of Israel, David, was a shepherd before he became king. The Old Testament regularly refers to God speaking to His people and referring to Himself as the Good Shepherd, the One Who truly cares for His helpless sheep. And, as the New Testament tells us, this Baby in the manger is the Son of God, that Good Shepherd, as well as the prophetically foretold descendant of the ex-shepherd, that great king David. After the Baby in the manger grew up, He, just like His Father, would constantly refer to Himself as the Good Shepherd, the one Shepherd Who could be trusted to truly care for His sheep, especially those who most needed care.

And what was the full nature of this Good Shepherd, this gift from God? He was the fulfillment of all the promises made by God to His people throughout all of the Old Testament. This Baby would be the eternal reconciliation of humanity and God for the sin of Adam and Eve and its repercussions throughout time. He would be the eternal King of God's people on earth. God continually promised good things to His chosen people. With the birth of Christ, He delivered all of them. Not only that, but He would no longer need to constantly admonish them, because His Son would provide complete forgiveness of all sins, past, present, and future. The entire relationship between God and humanity changed forever because of that first Christmas.

Of course, nobody knew any of this on that first Christmas. But thirty years later, after the Baby had grow up, the world would start to take notice. First, the chosen people of the Old Testament, and soon even the Gentiles would begin to learn of God's gift of His Son. He went about doing good, healing the sick, curing the lame, even raising the dead. He lived the life of the Good Shepherd as He fulfilled the prophesies of Isaiah and the others who foretold His coming. He did what they said He would, God again delivered on His promises. And after only three short years, He would give us His greatest gift. The Good Shepherd would not only care for His sheep, He would lay down His life for them. But the night before He did that, He gave us His greatest gift, one again foreseen in the Old Testament. For just as God fed His people with daily bread from Heaven in the form of manna in the desert of Sinai, Jesus gave us the perfect and eternal bread, His Body and Blood in the form of bread in the Eucharist, to feed His sheep forever.



CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME:

Today is the Fourth Sunday of Advent. The liturgical color is purple. Today's Gospel, Luke 1:26-38), is the beautiful story of the Annunciation of the Blessed Mother. Because Christmas Eve is also the Fourth Sunday of Advent this year, this gospel is the perfect one to usher in the Christmas story. Mary was visited by the angel, whose message completely changed her life forever. When Mary was told she would bring a son into this world, she was naturally confused and questioned it. At that point in her life, she was engaged or betrothed to Joseph, whose lineage was of the House of David. Engaged in those days was very different than today. There were serious consequencfor a woman who become pregnant before the marriage. The penalty was deadly. Mary understandably expressed her confusion to the angel that she was a virgin. After his explanation, Mary, who was probably in her late teens, completely said YES to God's plan. Even though having a child seemed impossible to her, she relied on her faith and hope in God and gave consent. At that moment, God's plan for salvation was activated. To comfort Mary and show her how everything is possible for God, the angel also spoke to her regarding her elderly cousin, Elizabeth who was in her 6th month of pregnancy. That too was impossible. All the foretelling in the Old Testament had come to life. For Mary, this was just the beginning of God fulfilling His promises in dynamic ways. The Annunciation shows us Mary's trust, faithfulness, obedience, humility, and discipleship.

She is our perfect role model. In her motherly role, she is the one we can go to for protection, guidance, and overall assistance. God's salvation has been given to humanity through her unconditional YES!

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Mary's Yes changed the world. Because she said yes, she became a mother, both Mother of Christ and the Mother of the Church." (CCC, 963-75) Children are so excited with the stories that set our focus on the Birth of Jesus.

What is very evident to them is how different everything was way back when??? They find it challenging to think of a world that compared to today's time, had so little. Yet, children can become easily attracted to the simplicity of the Christmas story. This is the perfect time of the year to point out how Mary had confidence in God's plan for her even when she didn't understand. That confidence came from prayer and study. Taking some time to go into a little detail about the birth of Jesus is a great conversation to have when putting up the creche. (If your family doesn't have a creche, it is a great thing to get.) The creche is not a Christmas decoration, but rather, the creche is Christmas visually for us. This week, younger children will enjoy making Hope Cards. The cards should say, "Nothing is impossible for God." Ask children to decorate these cards to announce the wonderful birth of Jesus. Send some of these cards to family, friends, hospitals, or other places where people are in need of Hope. Have a conversation about how each family member can say Yes to God this

Christmas 2023

To the People of God of the Diocese of Rockville Centre:

Merry Christmas to you and your families!

In recent years at Christmas, I have meditated on the relationship between the Nativity of the Prince of Peace and the Parable of the Good Samaritan.

I have been especially inspired by Pope Francis' analysis of the Parable of the Good Samaritan in the second chapter of his 2020 encyclical *Fratelli Tutti*. It is powerful and provocative, and I would recommend it for your mental prayer.

The short phrase in the Christmas Gospel narrative in the second chapter of the Gospel of Luke reads: "She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn."

"No room for them in the inn." No Good Samaritan stepped up to help the Holy Family. They were ignored and treated perfunctorily and impatiently. Some passed them by. Some pretended not to notice their plight.

Remember too that in the Parable of the Good Samaritan an "inn" is also mentioned. Luke 10 reads: "But a Good Samaritan while traveling came near him, and when he saw him, he was moved with pity. He went to him and bandaged his wounds, having poured oil and wine on them. Then he put him on his own animal, brought him to an inn and took care of him."

The inn that the Holy Family approaches on the way to Bethlehem is a sign of rejection and indifference.

The inn in the Parable of the Good Samaritan is a sign of the Good Samaritan's compassion and commitment to go the extra mile and to make sure that the wounded man is taken care of until he is completely healed.

Contemporary literary criticism might very well emphasize that the use of "inn" by the Gospel writer in both the Nativity in Luke 2 and the Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10 is not by accident.

In a sense, the phrase "there was no room at the inn" in the Nativity foreshadows and connects with the phrase in the Parable of the Good Samaritan describing the callous indifference of both the priest and the Levite toward the wounded man on the side of the road: "[H]e passed by on the other side."

As Pope Francis says in Fratelli Tutti: "Each day we have to decide whether to be Good Samaritans or indifferent bystanders."

Our Lady, St. Joseph and the unborn Christ Child experienced the reality of people who decided to be indifferent bystanders.

The Christmas Gospel narrative from Luke 2 poses a question which is posed again later in the Parable of the Good Samaritan in Luke 10.

Will we be Good Samaritans?

Or will we be indifferent bystanders?

As the Holy Father reminds us, we make that choice every day.

May our prayer, silent contemplation and creative family catechesis of the Nativity scene help us to be instruments of a Nativity Mystery. May the Good Samaritan Gospel revolution of humility, charity, mercy, tenderness and peace unite us in solidarity with the sick, the poor and the suffering, especially in the Middle East, Ukraine and all war-ravaged areas of the world.

May our commitment to "holiness and mission" bless our contemplative Synodal listening and our Eucharistic Revival and Evangelization.

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to you and your families!

May the Light and Love of the Christ Child animate and guide our global Catholic Missionary Spirit on this Christmas night and throughout the New Year.


