

This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

EUCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic

Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. 

What's Pastor Thinking

Ever notice how many times a day we seek recommendations or give

to our friends, listen to our parents, listen to teachers; we listen to voices over the media. We read the endorsements on the back of books to see whether we should buy them. So, we are heavily influenced by recommendations.

Whether it's movies, books, restaurants, lawyers, doctors, stockbrokers, we usually recommend what closest person to him, his brother. So Simon, son of we have personally experienced and benefited from. We'll pipe up and say, "This is terrific, why don't you try it?" "You've just got to see this!" "You won't believe this!" Or in the words of our Gospel, we might say, "Come and see!"

"Come and you will see!" Jesus tells two of John's disciples in our gospel today when they come looking around to see if Jesus truly is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. "Come and see," Jesus tells them. So they do. They come and see Jesus, follow Him on His way home from work one afternoon, walk through the neighborhood to His home. They sit in His home,

have supper with Him and then they make their decision. Andrew immediately excuses himself them out? We listen to critics, listen from the table. "Just a minute, Jesus, I'll be right back." Forty-five minutes later, Andrew returns with his brother Peter in tow. He has given his brother a very high recommendation of Jesus. "We have found the Messiah."

> So Andrew discovers some good bit of news and his first response is to reach out to share it with the John, becomes Petros, the Rock, and follows Jesus. Jesus invites. "Come and See." What about us? What does this story tell us about our church and school at St. Aidan? Three words. "Come and see!" That's our message to the world. That's the message we need to offer our neighbors and friends and family members. "Come and see!" 

JANUARY 21ST IS SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

January is a great month for celebrations in the Church. We had the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord. Now on January 21st, the 3rd Sunday of Ordinary Time we celebrate "Sunday of the Word of God". St John's Gospel opens with the proclamation, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In Greek 'the Word' is 'Logos.' Logos means the intelligible expression of God's mind. So the Bible is the written Word of God and Jesus is the incarnate Word of God. St. Paul in his letters, tells us that the Church is the mystical Word of God, the body of Christ lived out in the world today. So, the Word of God is Jesus Christ, the Sacred Scriptures, and the Church. This rich and varied meaning of the Word of God is why "the Church has always venerated the Scriptures as she venerates the Lord's Body. She never ceases to present to the faithful the bread of life, taken from the one table of God's Word and Christ's Body." (CCC 103). As we celebrate our Sunday of the Word of God, we are reminded of the importance of this logos in our daily lives. In his Apostolic Letter, Aperuit Illis (Instituting the Sunday of the Word of God), Pope Francis tells us he proposed this celebration so that we could "appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in the constant dialogue between the Lord and His people." May we be reminded in this celebration that the Word of God is a living word and should be ever a part of our daily lives and our daily prayers.

CHURCH IN NEED COLLECTION

On January 28, 2024 a collection will be taken for "The Church in Need." The monies collected at this time will be shared among three areas of the world where there is particular need for help:

- Church in Central and Eastern Europe this collection supports the Church in more than 25 countries that struggle to recover from former communist rule. It also aids communities throughout the region that are affected by the war in Ukraine. Funds support pastoral care, catechesis, renovations, and seminary formation.
 Your support restores the Church and builds the future in this region.
- The Church in Latin America For many in Latin America and the Caribbean, a rising secular culture, difficult rural terrain, and a shortage of ministers all present obstacles to practicing the faith. Your support for the collection provides lay leadership training, catechesis, priestly and religious formation, and other programs to share our Catholic faith with those who long to hear the Good News of Christ.
- The Church in Africa The Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa supports pastoral projects to build the capacity of the Church and foster lasting peace and reconciliation across a continent often marked by division and tension. Although the Church in Africa is growing, many still lack access to basic resources and pastoral care.

ARE YOU SEARCHING?

Are you searching for a faith to follow? Do you know someone who may be interested in learning more about what the Catholic Church believes and teaches? Were you

baptized as an infant but not raised in the faith or raised in another Christian faith? Whatever your situation, wherever you are in your faith journey, OCIA (formally RCIA) is here for YOU. OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. 

Annual Sunday of the Word of God, January 21, 2024 Instituted by Pope Francis in his Apostolic letter "Aperuit Illis", September 30, 2019. Excerpts from "Aperuit Illis": "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures" (Lk 24:45). "This was one of the final acts of the risen Lord before his Ascension. Jesus appeared to the assembled disciples, broke bread with them and opened their minds to the understanding of the sacred Scriptures. To them, amid their fear and bewilderment, he unveiled the meaning of the paschal mystery: that in accordance with the Father's eternal plan he had to suffer and rise from the dead, in order to bring repentance and the forgiveness of sins (cf. Lk 24:26.46-47). He then promised to send the Holy Spirit, who would give them strength to be witnesses of this saving mystery (cf. Lk 24:49)."

"With this Letter, I wish to respond to the many requests I have received from the people of God that the entire Church celebrate, in unity of purpose, a Sunday of the Word of God." "Consequently, I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God. This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity."

As part of our thankfulness for God's gift of the Bible, the Word of God, Americans can learn and protect our 1st amendment religious freedoms. In our teachings, CFFR speakers too often meet students whose rights to live their faith in public schools are denied. A student wearing clothing with a Bible verse is a frequent target of discipline in public schools. Reading the Bible and religious books during free reading time is another right often denied. On Long Island, for example, a high school senior with a strong dedication to the Bible read his Bible during free reading time. One day a teacher noticed what he was reading and proceeded to mock the student and to encourage other students to mock him for reading the Bible. These school personnel are ignoring the "U.S. Dept. of Education and Dept. of Justice's Guidance on Constitutionally Protected Prayer and Religious Expression in Public Schools" which protects, among other things, students' religious themed clothing and the reading of religious materials.

LITURGY COLUMN

Next on the roster of Doctors of the Church, and the last of the early ones, is Athanasius of Alexandria, c. 296 – 2 May 373. He was a Bishop, Church Father, and the chief defender of Trinitarianism against Arianism. His episcopacy spanned 45 years (c. 8 June 328 – 2 May 373), including 17 years covering five different periods of exile, during which he was replaced by the orders of four different emperors, plus several other times when he had to flee for his life. As we saw with other Doctors of the Church, opposing heresies was both a religious and political minefield.

Around the year 319, when Athanasius was a deacon, a presbyter named Arius came into a direct conflict with Patriarch (Bishop) Alexander of Alexandria. Arius denounced Alexander for what he claimed were heretical teachings. Arius' opinion was that Christ was the Son of God, but did not always exist but rather was begotten, or made, before time by God the Father, and, therefore, Jesus was not coeternal with God the Father, which was a common Christological view in Alexandria at the time. Alexander then excommunicated Arius who began to seek support from other bishops and civil authorities who agreed with him. This conflict with Arianism, as well as with several Roman emperors supporting it, shaped Athanasius' career. In 325, at age 27, Athanasius began his leading role against the Arians as a deacon and assistant to Bishop Alexander during the First Council of Nicaea, eventually succeeding Alexander as Bishop a few years later.

Arianism was one of several heresies during the early centuries of the Church, but it was one of the most, if not the most, influential one. It was favored by many civil authorities, notably several emperors of the Roman Empire. This is what led to Athanasius' repeated exiles, as well as the roughly half-dozen times he had to flee to save his life. At the height of the influence of Arianism, a majority of both Church leaders and emperors supported it, so much so that St. Jerome wrote in despair that "The whole world groaned and was amazed to find itself Arian". Athanasius, was even excommunicated by Pope Liberius who himself was exiled and leaned toward compromise, leaving Athanasius standing almost alone in defense of the truth. But it was his ability to not only live, but to flourish as an author and defender of the faith in this environment that established Athanasius as a pre-eminent Doctor of the Church in both the Eastern and Western branches of the faith. Both as Bishop and in exile, he was a prolific author. Among his more influential works are a two-part work of apologetics (formal argumentation in defense of doctrine), Against the Heathen and The Incarnation of the Word of God, completed about 335, in which he describes the Son of God as the eternal Word through whom God made the world, and Who took human form to restore the harmony between God and mankind. This view was vigorously opposed by the Arians which led to his Apology Against the Arians. Later, from exile, he authored a major theological opus Four Orations Against the Arians and defended his conduct in the Apology to Constantius and Apology for His Flight followed by a History of the Arians, in which he referred to Emperor Constantius as a precursor of the Antichrist. He was certainly not lacking in courage! In 362 he convened the Synod of Alexandria, during which he appealed for unity among those who held the same faith but differed in terminology thus laying the foundation for the orthodox doctrine of the Trinity. This offended the emperor, Julian the Apostate, who exiled him again until Julian's death in 363. In 365 the emperor Valens, who was an Arian, continued the exile, but the local authorities in Alexandria persuaded the emperor to reconsider, allowing Athanasius to spend a few years in peace before his death in 373. Within a few years of his death, Gregory of Nazianzus called him the "Pillar of the Church". His writings were highly regarded by Church fathers in both the West and the East, especially with regard to the doctrine of the Word-become-man. Historian Cornelius Clifford says of him: "Athanasius was the greatest champion of Catholic belief on the subject of the Incarnation that the Church has ever known and in his lifetime earned the characteristic title of 'Father of Orthodoxy', by which he has been distinguished ever since." St. John Henry Newman describes him as a "principal instrument after the Apostles, by which the sacred truths of Christianity have been conveyed and secured to the world". No wonder Athanasius is considered one of the four great Eastern Doctors of the Church as well as in the Roman Catholic Church, and is venerated as a saint in the Eastern Orthodox Church, the Catholic Church, the Coptic Orthodox Church, the Anglican Communion, and Lutheranism.





CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME:

Today is the Second Sunday in Ordinary
Time. The liturgical color is green. We
are now in the shorter of the two
periods of Ordinary Time in the
Liturgical (Church) Year that occurs
between the Christmas season and Lent.
Today's Gospel, (John 1:35-42) begins
with the John the Baptist and two of

John's followers. When John saw Jesus, he recognized Him by calling Jesus the Lamb of God. John's followers left then went to Jesus who asked them about what they were looking for. Jesus invited them to "Come and See!" And so, they did. Andrew, the first of Jesus' formal followers, told his brother, Simon about what happened. When Simon went to Jesus, Jesus changed his name from Simon to Cephas, which means Peter.

This gospel brings us to the start of Jesus' public ministry. He was beginning to call forward those He would spend most of His time with, those who would receive His direct instruction, those He would consider His closest friends. We can see how Jesus' very presence drew these men to Him. Andrew going to get his brother shows us how discipleship is spread from person to person. The invitation to "Come and see" is the invitation that we respond to as followers of Jesus in today's world. The message of "Come and see" actively portrayed through our lives as Missionary Disciples calls us to engage in having our thoughts, words, and actions become beacons of invitation for others to want to know what we know, live Jesus' message as we live it, and share that message with others. The Good News about Jesus is given for all people. We are charged with the responsibility to pass on this Good News, especially to our children. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "All people are called into relationship with God. (CCC,1) Jesus invites each person to follow him. (CCC,542-43). Each one of us is called holiness. We receive this call at our Baptism. (CCC, 825) Through Baptism, we are also called into unity with one another." (CCC, 836.) Children, especially school age and older

Children, especially school age and older children, understand how fast news gets around. Sometimes, the news is good and other times not. Most children find Jesus asking His first followers to "Come

and see" exciting. Younger children can imagine what it must have been like to leave everything and follow Jesus. The idea sounds like a great adventure. Older children usually think that Jesus' followers took a very bold step in completely trusting in the Jesus they just met. With a little discussion, it is a gospel that challenges them to realize that Jesus is calling them and will continue to call them into new levels of relationship with Him. The nuclear family is definitely the place where children can begin to practice being attentive and willing to accept Jesus' invitation to "Come and see." This week, talk with older children about what they would ask Jesus if they interviewed Him. Questions like the

following may be great conversation starters: What was it like growing up with Mary and Joseph? What is your most important teaching? What would you like your followers to remember about you? Ask children to think of someone who has responded well to his/her call to be a good disciple/follower of Jesus? Examples may include a priest, a teacher, a family member, or a friend. Ask them to describe the characteristics

of these faithful followers. Younger school age children may enjoy writing their names in the middle of a paper and then drawing a circle around their names. Then ask them to draw or write some things they do as Catholics. Some examples would be attending Mass, praying, reading the Bible or listening attentively to Bible stories, doing some form of service etc. Then ask them to draw lines connecting their names to the things they do as Catholics. Hang up these special Catholic identity pages! With very young children act out how people

are called by Jesus and then how they call others to follow Jesus. One older child or adult can be Jesus. Call the child and then ask the child to go get another follower. When there are multiple children in the family, it is a fun activity that is well connected to this gospel. Introduce children to the priest at Sunday Mass. Remind them that the priest helps us grow closer to God. You can go through the various ways priests serve the People of God.

Being called is like most things spiritual, a life-long journey. Following the Path Jesus calls us to can be challenging, even very bumpy at times, but a true follower of Jesus will prevail because God has promised to be with us, and God always keeps His promises. God empowers us in whatever ways we need to be strong and carry on. He also empowers us to assist one another so we can support each other in our journeys. Parents and trusted adults who interact with children have a great opportunity to pass on the faith to the children entrusted to them. Isn't that how most of us came into the faith? That is why we have one another! May we pass on the faith well in 2024!

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them,

"What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" — which translated means Teacher —, "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" — which is translated Christ —. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" — which is translated Peter

NICENE CREED


