This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold SCAM LIKELY a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin. Email:

What's Pastor Thinking

Both St. Valentine's Day and Ash Wednesday fall on the same day this year. One calls us to give chocolates, and the other calls us to give them up!

One proclaims love with flowers, the other with palm ashes. For Catholics, Ash Wednesday has precedence and the Church does not issue dispensations at this time. And although Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation, and one is not obliged to attend Mass, nor is one obliged to receive ashes—it is the doorway of the entire Lenten Season. It is a day of faith, repentance and renewal; a day of conversion, of turning away from sin and back to God. Who among us doesn't need to hear and heed that message? At St. Aidan ashes will be distributed at the end of Mass on Ash Wednesday at 6:30 AM, 9:00 AM, 12:00 PM and 5:30 PM. Ashes will also be distributed at a Prayer Service at 3:30 PM. The ashes come from a previous Palm Sunday. The palms are burned, the ashes collected and then crushed into a fine, sooty powder.

Everyone 14 years of age or older is called to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. On Ash Wednesday one full meatless meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs.

The word 'Lent' comes from the Old English word 'lente,' meaning 'springtime.' The days are lengthening and nature is renewed. So the season of is a spiritual springtime, a time to be renewed through prayer, fasting and almsgiving.

PRAYER. There are various types of prayer, of course:

personal and public, liturgical and devotional, parish retreats and days of recollection. Whenever we make time for God in prayer, we share our hopes and fears, our disappointments and dreams. And we listen to God, seeking to know his will more clearly so that we can do his will more faithfully every day. Silence is such an essential element of the spiritual life, for it quiets the heart, mind and soul, allowing God to break through the incessant clatter of our culture.

FASTING. Lent is also a time of sacrifice — of fasting and abstaining from meat when the church requires us to do so. Most of us "give up" other little things too — dessert, coffee, alcohol, technology — those simple attachments that prevent us from lifting our hearts and minds to heaven.

GOOD WORKS. Lent is also a time of good works, of almsgiving. Perhaps we give some extra money to charity, or visit someone who is ill, or welcome the stranger, a new family, into our neighborhood. Or maybe we seek reconciliation with a former friend or family member from whom we've been alienated for a long time. Our works of charity allow us to share our blessings with others and keep us attuned to the needs of our brothers and sisters, at home and around the world.

Our faith is nothing more than our longing for God, and his for us. Like any romance, our relationship with God has to be nurtured and nourished if it is to prosper and grow. That's what the observance of Lent, with its prayer, fasting and good works, helps us to do. Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day have a lot in common after all, for the goal of both is to renew our passion for the one we love.

FIRST RECONCILIATION

Congratulations to those who are receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time. We will greet you when you arrive in church for 11:00 AM or 1:30 PM Service. Simply choose a seat, kneel and pray, do the examination of conscience, then we will guide your child into the confessional. After confession return to your seat and pray your penance. Your child will be presented with the act of contrition prayer. During class they will have learned everything about the sacrament but children can be a bit nervous on the day. Parents, please talk to them about this great sacrament and thank you for accompanying your family in their faith journey. This Guide to Confession for Children might help.

GUIDE TO CONFESSION FOR CHILDREN

Before going to confession, do an Examination of Conscience. Pray: Come Holy Spirit; help me to know my sins, confess them to the priest, and to be truly sorry for them. Amen. Think about the bad choices you made. Think about the 10 commandments and anytime you disobeyed them.

- Did I lie to my parents? My teachers? My friends?
- Did I take anything that didn't belong to me?
- Did I say mean things to my mom or dad?
- Did I do what my mom and dad told me to do?

- Did I do my chores?
- Did I fight with my brothers or sisters or friends?
- Did I call someone bad names?
- Did I hit someone when I got mad?
- Am I hard to get along with?
- Have I blamed other people for something I did?
- Did I get other people into trouble?
- Have I said "I'm sorry" after being mean to someone, or disobeying my parents?
- Have I cheated or been unfair in games?

RECONCILIATION STEPS

- The priest welcomes you and prays the Sign of the Cross with you. Then you say: "Bless me Father for I have sinned. This is my first Confession and these are my sins..."
- 2. Confess your sins. The priest may talk to you to help you.
- 3. The priest gives you a penance. This can be prayers to say or good deeds to do. Remember your penance so you can do it.
- 4. Pray the Act of Contrition
- 5. The Priest absolves you "in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."
- 6. The priest will dismiss you by saying, "Go in peace." You can say "Thank you Father."

OCIA 2024: RITE OF SENDING FORTH TO ELECTION

Next Sunday, the First Sunday of Lent, our parish catechumens: Skylar Stone, Arian Munoz, and Rebekah Persaud will take the next step on their journey to Baptism. They will be presented to Bishop Barres through the Rite of Election at St. Agnes Cathedral. The

Rite of Election is only celebrated by those who have never been baptized. During the Election ritual, each catechumen goes up to the altar to sign the diocesan Book of the Elect showing that he/she is formally requesting to receive the Sacrament of Baptism. Our parish will show its support for them as they continue their journey toward Baptism by celebrating the Rite of Sending Forth at the 12 PM Mass. The Period of Election/Enlightenment is the third step of the OCIA process. From now until the Easter Vigil, Skylar, Arian, and Rebekah will be referred to as the Elect. Throughout Lent, they will be celebrating some preparatory "rites" as they continue toward Baptism. Please continue to keep all the OCIA participants as well as the OCIA Team in your prayers.

Traditional Latin Mass is Celebrated in the U.S. Capitol One Year after the Leak of the FBI Memo Linking Traditional Catholics to Domestic Terrorists On Jan. 23, 2024 the Traditional Latin Mass was celebrated inside the Capitol of the United States in response to an invitation from House Speaker Mike Johnson, House Judiciary Committee Chairman, Jim Jordan, and Congressman Dan Meuser to coincide with the one year anniversary of the leaking of the contested memo from multiple FBI offices claiming that extremists and terrorist groups were connected with traditional Catholic communities.

The Arlington Latin Mass society coordinated the event and reported that invitations to the Mass were limited in deference to Traditionis Custodis. About 60 people were in attendance including some Congressional staffers, but no members of Congress were present as they were out of town on recess.

After the controversial memo was made public, the FBI stated the memo would be withdrawn as it did not meet FBI standards. However, a Jan. 31, 2024 letter from 15 GOP Senators to FBI Director, Christopher Wray, asked for intact records from the FBI regarding the memo, since the records were allegedly permanently deleted after the memo became public. The Senators want to

clear up differences between Director Wray's testimony and new information on the surveillance of Catholics. This is the memo that Cardinal Dolan, speaking in Feb., 2023 as then Chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Religious Freedom found to be 'troubling and offensive.' The Jan, 16, 2024 USCCB's Annual Report on the State of Religious Liberty in the U.S. also pointed out concerns regarding this troubling action by the FBI.

LITURGY COLUMN

This week marks the beginning of Lent. It is early this year; it feels like we just finished the Christmas season. But it could be even a bit earlier. It is hard to keep track of the beginning of Lent, since it varies every year. But there are specific rules for the dates on which Lent begins and ends.

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent, and it is always 46 days before Easter Sunday, which is also a movable feast. And the date for Easter must be determined first, after which Ash Wednesday is easy, 46 days before. So, you might ask, how is the date for Easter determined? For Roman Catholics and other western branches of Christianity, the tradition is that Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday following the first full moon of spring and this dates back to the Council of Nicaea in 325, as do many other of our traditions. For what it is worth, Passover is determined in a similar fashion, which it is why it is always close to Easter. But Passover is based on a lunar calendar, while we use a solar calendar, so they do not exactly coincide. It is, however, logical that Easter is related to Passover. The Last Supper was a Passover meal, so the first Easter had to be close after. Since the date of Easter determines many other dates for celebrations and observances, the early Church found it important to announce the date of Easter early each year. And if you were paying attention on Epiphany, those dates were announced by the Deacon or Priest at Mass. This, logically, is called the Epiphany proclamation. In case you missed it, this year Easter falls on March 31. Next, how is Lent calculated? Didn't I just say 46 days before Easter? Isn't Lent 40 days? Lent wasn't always 40 days. It began as only a few days of fasting and in some cases, just 40 hours of preparation before Easter. Later

the Church adopted a tradition of 36 days of fasting and prayer, representing a tenth of the calendar year. So why 46, or 40 days? That came later, and it also dates back to the Council of Nicaea, but with a little more baggage. The council stated that two synods should be held each year, "one before the 40 days of Lent" which may be traced to St. Athanasius (d.373) who wrote to his congregation to make a 40-day fast before the more intense fast during Holy Week. Finally, Pope St. Leo I (d. 461) preached that the faithful must "fulfill with their fasts the Apostolic institution of the 40 days,". So by the end of the fifth century, we know that the 40-day period of Easter preparation known as Lent existed, and that prayer and fasting were its major devotions.

So why 40 days? 40 is an important number with special spiritual significance in the Bible. In Exodus, we read that Moses stayed with the Lord for "40 days and 40 nights" on Mt. Sinai when he received the Ten Commandments. Later, in 1 Kings, Elijah walked "40 days and 40 nights" to the mountain of the Lord, Mount Horeb (another name for Sinai). And, of course, in the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus fasted and prayed for "40 days and 40 nights" in the desert before He began His public ministry. But that is 40 days, not 46, and Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, 46 days before Easter. Lent is 40 days because the 6 Sundays in Lent are not included in the official "Lenten fast" because each Sunday is a special remembrance of the Resurrection of Christ. So if you subtract 6 from 46, you get the 40 days of Lent.

So now you know. And just to return to the start, Ash Wednesday is early this year, but the earliest it can be is February 4, with Easter falling on March 22. And the latest date is March 10, with Easter then being on April 25. Now one last thing. Please come to the Church on Ash Wednesday. Listen to what is said when the sign of the cross is placed on your forehead. You will hear either "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" both of which remind us of why we celebrate Lent in preparation for the feast of Easter, when Jesus proved what He said, and offered us forgiveness from our sins and eternal life after human death, if only we listen to Him and repent. Then wear your ashes proudly as you leave Church. This is the one day when many Catholics do what we are told at the end of every Mass: go out and share our faith with the world.

CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME:

Today is Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. The liturgical color is green. Today's Gospel, (Mark 1:40-45), is the story of Jesus curing the Leper. In Jesus' time, Many feared that they would catch the disease, which ultimately would lead to a slow, isolated death. If a person was cured of leprosy, which was a rarity, it was thought to be from divine intervention since it was commonly known that there was no cure. We have seen in the gospels of recent weeks that news of Jesus' healings was spreading from town to town. Undoubtably, this leper heard about these events and so he boldly approached Jesus asking to be healed. Jesus responded both verbally and by actually touching the man. Touching a leper would be enough to cause the Jewish community of the time to expel anyone who would dare to do this. Therefore, Jesus broke the law. The leper was instantly cured.

The leper's healing wasn't enough to allow him to return to the community and so Jeus sent the healed leper to fulfill the Jewish law by instructing him to show himself to the priests and to offer the prescribed offering. (Jesus wanted to be sure the man would be accepted back into Jewish society!) Other than appearing before the priests, Jesus asks the man not to "broadcast" his healing. The former leper just couldn't keep the Good News of what happened to himself, and so he proclaimed his healing to all he met!

running through this gospel story that children need to learn. God wants us to open ourselves to Him so He can change us where we need to be changed. Children find out early in life that suffering is a reality in our world. We know that violence and oppression are against God's plan. The mission of the People of God (the Church) is to announce the Good News about Jesus just as the leper wanted to share what Jesus had done for him with everyone. Through our growing understanding of God's love, we can alleviate the suffering of others in very concrete ways by trying to meet their needs. Performing these actions brings hope for a better future that conforms more closely with Jesus' message of love and service. This week with very young children, talk

about how Jesus touched the Leper. Give young children a few objects that they can touch and ask them to describe how these items feel. Talk about how it would feel to never be touched. What would it be like if they never knew what a hug felt like? Try to develop the idea that Lepers were never touched and so they never felt the caring of other people. Jesus wants us to use our ability to touch to bring His love to all we meet. Make a Prayer chain using strips of paper. Write the names of people or world situations that need God's help. Using a stapler, interlock the paper strips and add to the chain as different people or situations emerge. This is a great ongoing activity. With school-age children, focus on how Jesus made the Leper clean. Discuss all the ways we keep ourselves clean. Some examples would be: cleaning our bodies by washing them, cleaning our minds by thinking good thoughts, cleaning our hearts by doing good, and keeping our souls clean by telling Jesus we are sorry when we sin. If the children have already celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation, this is a great exercise before receiving this sacrament and a wonderful way to prepare for

Reconciliation during Lent. (This same activity works well with older children adding some things they relate well to like thinking good thoughts because they are selective in the television shows they watch, and the video games they play!) Especially during this time of Eucharistic Revival, older children should be taught about the healing power of the Eucharist. Every time we receive Holy Communion, we encounter Jesus, body, blood, soul, and divinity. We are "touched" by Jesus in the deepest, most intimate way. Older children should be reminded to ask Jesus for whatever they need. Ask them to reflect on what healing they need from Jesus just as the Leper did. (Remember, what they need and not just what they want!!!) Talk to older children about how Ministers of the Sick bring Holy Communion to the homes of people who cannot attend Mass due to age or illness. Maybe you or someone who is part of this ministry who could tell your children about what they do and why they do it.

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the first day of the season of Lent. It is also Valentine's Day, a day we celebrate love. It would be next to impossible to erase Valentine's Day for children because they are surrounded by it in school and everywhere else. So, why not put Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day together by teaching children that there is no greater love we can experience than the love of Jesus. Perhaps a lot of Valentine's treats could be given but "postponed" until Sunday when even though it is still Lent, the church always celebrates the Resurrection and so Lenten practices are set aside to honor that followers of Jesus are truly Easter people. Doing something like this can help children celebrate in the present and anticipate with great desire the future. Definitely come to church on Ash Wednesday, not just for some grains of dirt, but to begin a journey with God who will bring all of us closer to Him. Now that's something to celebrate!






