This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions. For the safety of all, the church doors will be closed when school children attend services during the week.

## PARKING AT ST. AIDAN

The number of parking spaces is limited at St. Aidan. The parking lot at the rear of the Upper School and the one on Dover Street are available on weekends and when school is closed. The Lower School has an area that is designated a children's play area. People with disabilities may park in the three reserved parking spaces in front of the rectory on Willis Ave. This special area is needed for church access by people who use wheelchairs and specially-equipped vehicles. Thank you for being parking considerate.

## BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism. Private baptisms are held on Saturday or Sunday when the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

## RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Holy Communion unites us more closely to Jesus, and it is also a sign that we are living in communion with His Church, following the teachings that Jesus has handed down to us. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

## CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church, screen only, on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

## ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

## MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. ## What's Pastor Thinking

Near the end of his life St. Patrick wrote his autobiography known as his 'Confessions.' He comes across as the humblest of men. He describes

himself as the lowliest of all the faithful. His father was a deacon and from his confessions we know that he was a citizen of the Roman Empire.

Patrick talks about his youth. He was only 16 when taken, as a slave, to Ireland with many thousands of others. He said that he deserved this fate because he had turned away from God; He goes on: *'we neither kept His commandments nor obeyed our pastors who used to warn us about our salvation. While in captivity the Lord made me aware of my unbelief that I might at last advert to my sins and turn wholeheartedly back to Him again. However, God was very patient with me because of my youth and ignorance and he looked after me like a father. Great benefits of grace were bestowed on me in my captivity.'*

It was during his time in exile in Ireland that he learned how to pray. He goes on: *'in the course of a single day I would say as many as a hundred prayers and indeed as many at night. Even in times of snow or frost or rain I would rise before dawn to pray.'*

Patrick was a slave for about six years in Ireland until he escaped back to his own country. One night while he was with his relatives in Britain he had a dream. *'I saw a man who appeared to have come from Ireland with an unlimited number of letters. Opening one of them I read the words 'the voice of the Irish - we ask you boy to come and walk once more among us.'* Then I

woke up.'

In the year 432 his dream was realized. He was sent by the Pope Celestine back to Ireland, not as a slave anymore but as a missionary bishop.

Patrick goes on: *'I came to the Irish heathen to preach the gospel and put up with insults from unbelievers. I had my mission abused; I endured many persecutions even to the extent of chains. However, I am ready to gladly and willingly give my life for these people and if God spares me, I want to spend the rest of my life with them.'*

Patrick was full of missionary zeal and enthusiasm despite set-backs of all sorts. Even his fellow clergy spread rumors about him. They seem to be jealous of his success and always looked down on him for his lack of education. But Patrick did not hold this sin against them and put it down to their lack of understanding.

Towards the end of his life he wrote: *'This is my confession before I die. My success in Ireland is due to God's gift. I feel very protective towards these people and pray for perseverance in my mission. I will willingly and gladly lay down my life for the Irish if the Lord wishes it. I look forward to resurrection and Eternal life and am not concerned about the manner of my death.'*

We salute him today and pray that the faith which he brought to people with such enthusiasm centuries ago will not be lost on our present generation. The spreading of the gospel is as relevant today as it was when Patrick first set foot in Ireland all those centuries ago. ST PATRICK, PRAY FOR US.

# St. Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary

First Century  
Solemnity—March 19

The spouse of Mary the mother of Jesus and the legal father of Jesus according to Jewish law, Joseph is a model of humility and obedience to God's will. He followed God's instructions, given by angels in dreams, and took the pregnant Mary into his home as his wife, protected her and Jesus at the child's birth in Bethlehem through the family's sojourn in Egypt, and provided for them as a carpenter in

Nazareth. This feast, which was celebrated locally as early as the ninth century, became a universal feast in the fifteenth century, when it was placed on the liturgical calendar. Pope Pius IX named St. Joseph Patron of the Universal Church in 1870; he is also the patron saint of carpenters, the dying, and workers.



## Blessing of St. Joseph's Table

[1679]  
On the Solemnity of St. Joseph (March 19) it is the custom in some places to bless bread, pastries, and other food and give a large portion of it to the poor.

All make the sign of the cross as the leader says:

Our help is in the name of the Lord.  
R/. Who made heaven and earth.

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:

Listen to the words of the holy Gospel according to Matthew: **1:18-23**

Now this is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a

son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet:

"Behold, the virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,"

which means "God is with us."

### **LITURGICAL MINISTER TRAINING- SPRING 2024**

The Diocese of Rockville Center will offer training in Spanish and English for those who wish to serve as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and Lectors. No walk-ins permitted, all participants must be registered in advance with a letter from their pastor.

- Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion: Part A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training. A Lector Workshop is available for both new and experienced lectors.

The Call for Our Time: Defend Life and Religious Liberty

Whether the issue of religious freedom/freedom of conscience is the right to teach our children the faith, not being forced to fund abortion, evangelization, assembling for worship, the integrity of the words of the Bible, witnessing and advocating our faith and morals in the public square, operating foster parent adoption agencies, soup kitchens, homeless shelters, drug addiction services, etc., all Americans benefit from the God-given right of religious freedom. Our founders agreed with James Madison, “Conscience is the most sacred of all property.” The Declaration of Independence asserts that we have inalienable rights from our Creator and that government’s role is to protect those rights. Differing from the history of nations world-wide, the citizens of the new United States claimed the natural rights of life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness from their Creator, free from dictates by a king, emperor or all-powerful government.

We are, more than ever, experiencing unrelenting pressures to yield our right to follow our conscience in the choice for life. The ability to choose life, from conception to natural death, can be regulated and legislated away from us (by the proposed Equity Act) if freedom of conscience and religion are not preserved. Doctors, nurses and hospitals could be required, under proposed legislation, to participate in abortions as part of their licensing, and they could be required to implement certain end of life protocols which some see as denial of treatment.

Since the Supreme Court’s decision that there is no federal Constitutional right to abortion and therefore abortion laws are the purview of each state, those who demand unrestricted abortion are working feverishly within states for abortion on demand. Each American has the duty to learn and preserve our religious freedom’s right of conscience for ages and millions yet unborn.

### **LITURGY COLUMN**

Today is the fifth Sunday of Lent, and the third Scrutiny for our Candidates for full participation in our faith. So it is the last Sunday which will have a different Gospel at one Mass, and again, a long story from St. John’s Gospel, chapter 11, verses 1 to 45. It is the story of Jesus’ friend, Lazarus, the brother of Martha and Mary whom we see several times in the Gospels. But only in John do we see their brother, Lazarus. He is not the same person as the Lazarus seen in Luke, the poor beggar shown as the opposite of the rich man when they both die. The Lazarus in John also dies, but for a totally different reason. In fact, there is an awful lot in this story beyond just bringing a dead man back to life. Let’s put this story in perspective. First, Jesus is on His way to Jerusalem, a very dangerous place for Him at this point near the end of His earthly ministry. Clearly, He knows what is about to happen there, and if you read the next few verses in this chapter of John immediately following what is read in church, you will see that for the Pharisees, and especially the High Priest, Caiaphas, this miracle was the last straw. They had to get rid of Him. Next, Lazarus is not the only person Jesus (or Old Testament prophets) raised from the dead. But there is a significant difference. In the Old Testament tradition, a person who is dead for three days is totally, irreversibly dead. None of those raised from the dead in the Old Testament, nor the widow of Nain’s son nor Jairus’ daughter raised by Jesus, had been dead that long, so they were miraculous, but not without precedent. Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days. He was irrevocably dead. As an aside, remember that a short time later Jesus will rise on the third day from the irrevocably dead.

So what happens in this story? Martha and Mary send word to Jesus that “the one you love is sick.” As John constantly reminds us, love is what is important, and Jesus loved Lazarus, and his sisters hoped Jesus would come quickly and heal him. But Jesus deliberately delays, knowing that Lazarus will die. When He finally tells the apostles they are going to Judea, where Bethany is, they’re afraid because it is dangerous. And they don’t understand His comment that Lazarus has fallen asleep. Jesus has to explain that he is dead, and that is why they are going. Thomas has a great response. As is often the case, the apostles seem clueless, but since Jesus is determined to head into peril, Thomas says, “Let us also go, that we may die with him.” This from one of the guys who will run away a few days later when



things got really bad. When they get there, they find a crowd of mourners, and Martha, the sister who didn't seem to get Jesus as well as her sister Mary did last time we saw them, has a wonderful conversation with Jesus. She understands more than the apostles do. "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask." Jesus said to her, "Your brother will rise again." Martha answered, "I know he will rise again in the resurrection at the last day." Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. The one who believes in me will live, even though they die; and whoever lives by believing in me will never die. Do you believe this?" "Yes, Lord," she replied, "I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who is to come into the world." That about sums it up! Then Mary joins them, and they head for the tomb. When they get there, in the shortest verse in the Bible, John tells us "Jesus wept." Two simple words, but how beautifully John tells us Who Jesus is. He is fully God, Who is about to raise a definitively dead man from the dead, but He is fully human, and moved to tears by the death of a close friend and in the face of the grief of those present at the tomb. Those guests wonder why He didn't come sooner to heal Lazarus. They soon find out. "Take away the stone." But what about the

odor? "Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?" He then offers a brief prayer that includes just what Martha said earlier: "Father, I thank you that you have heard me. I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me." And then He says, "Lazarus, come out!" John doesn't tell us what the reaction of the crowd was, but I am sure they were absolutely astonished. Other than the Resurrection, which was not witnessed by anyone, this was the most impressive miracle Jesus performed. But here, the only reaction is that of the Pharisees and Caiaphas. He is too dangerous. We have to get rid of Him. May we take to heart what St. John is telling us. How deeply Jesus loves us. May the stone be rolled away from our eyes so that we may see as clearly as St. Martha and share her faith in Jesus, the God/Man Who is the Savior of all who believe in Him as she did. And may we trust as Jesus did that the Father always hears our prayers.

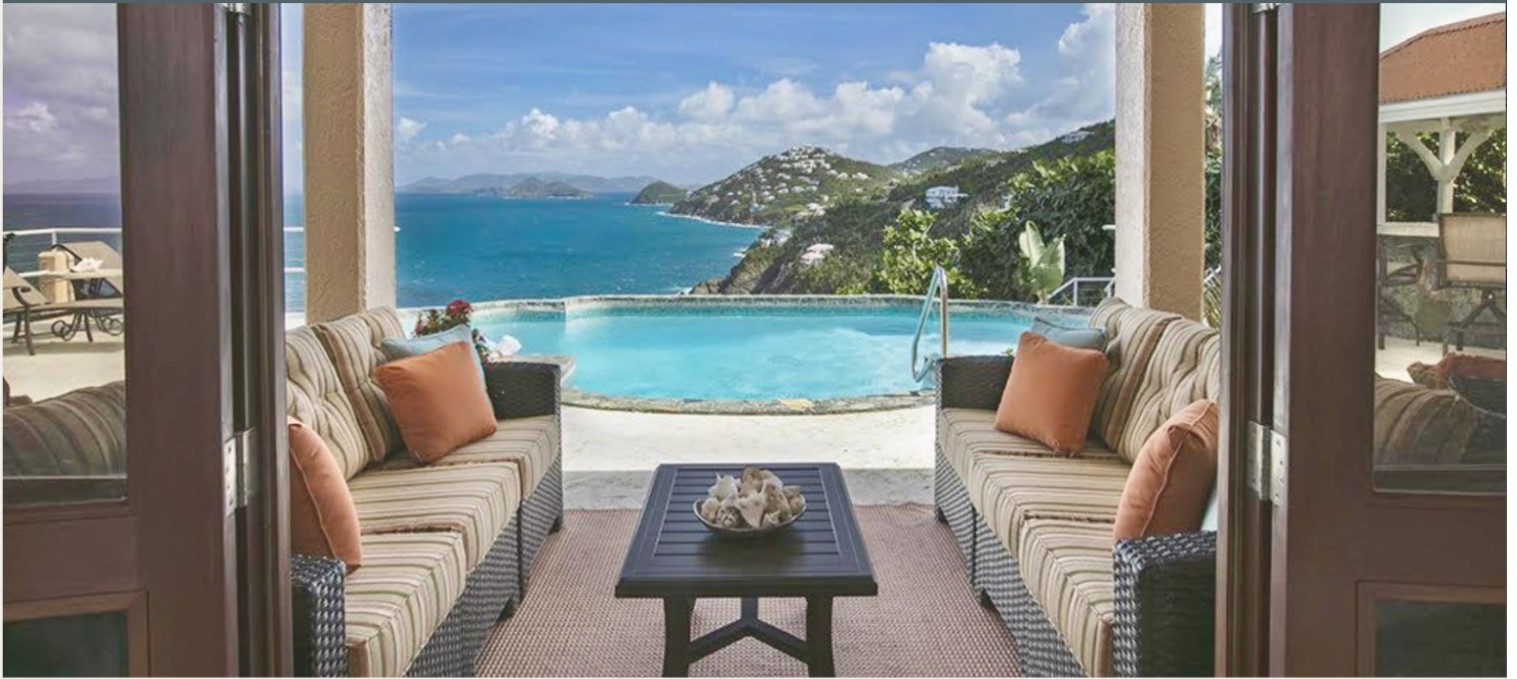

**CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME:** If you attend the 12PM Mass on Sunday, a different set of readings must be used because an OCIA ritual will take place during this Mass. The following is based on the Cycle B readings used at all the other Masses. Today is the Fifth Sunday of Lent. The liturgical color is Purple.

Gospel, (John 12:20-33), Jesus uses the analogy of a seed to speak about His impending death. The seed itself is worthless unless it dies so that the fruit or flower can blossom, and the plant would then reproduce. To save us and all humanity, Jesus was willing to offer Himself for us by dying on the cross.

There will be times when we must die to ourselves meaning we must stand firm as followers of Jesus even in the face of difficult consequences. Like the seed, we must be willing to undergo whatever transformations are necessary in order to produce the good fruit that comes with being faithful followers of Jesus. Needless to say, this is a very difficult gospel to process for most people, especially children. Children prefer gospel stories that are happy and joyful. They don't enjoy stories about pain, suffering, and death.

Using the idea of how a seed can grow into a beautiful plant that can provide beauty and depending on the type of plant productive fruit, they can accept that the seed must die or completely give up its cocoon of safety within the hardness of its covering to grow. Jesus is like the seed of our life with God. He is a perfect role model for us to imitate. Jesus wanted to share God with everyone, and we as His followers, should want to do the same. Everyday, we have opportunities to share God's life and love with others. Sometimes this can be very difficult, but Jesus will help us.

We should connect with Jesus many times every day through prayer and going to Mass where we can receive Jesus in Holy Communion. Then we will know how to pay attention to what God wants us to do. This week, plant a few beans into a cup of potting soil. Beans work particularly well because they sprout quickly. Once they do, dig up one of the sprouted beans so children

can see how the bean has changed. Because of this change, the bean will be able to produce a bean plant. Continue to care for the remaining sprouted beans and nurture them throughout the Easter season. Let the children observe the changes. The bean had to die or completely change its form to grow into the plant, which is an image for rising to new life. The next step in this type of analogy is to mention that Baptism transforms us by rising with Jesus to new life with God. Eventually, children begin to connect the pieces together! This week very young children explain that following Jesus means serving others. Cut out some paper footprints and make a path with them on the floor. At the end of the footprint path, have a pitcher of water and some cups ready. The whole family will need to get involved to make this activity work well. The first family member will pour a short cup of water. Then that person will serve the water to the next family who walks the path. One by one, each family member gets a turn to be served and to serve someone else. Remind everyone that following Jesus means serving others. Sometimes it might be difficult and challenging, but in the end, it is always rewarding to follow Jesus no matter what! Preschool children to school

age children may enjoy a Secret Service Bag. Using a drawstring bag, place items that could be used to serve others in the bag. Some examples would be plastic bandages, crayons, a dish towel, a Children's Bible, a children's prayer book or copy of a prayer, a stuffed animal, and a small toy. Each child or each family member will draw an item from the bag without peeking and then the discussion follows about how that item can be used to serve others. Some themes that would naturally develop would be that we serve others when we share what we have, when we take care of others who need healing, and when we pray for others. This activity can lead to great Lenten conversations. Think of different types of people who help others. examples would include parents, teachers, firefighters, police,

nurses, doctors, priests, secretaries, the people who ring you up in the stores, etc. Talk about how these people help others. Helping others is what a true disciple or follower of Jesus does. How can we help others? Ask each child to draw a picture, write, or discuss how he/she can help others. With older children, set up a Holy Week Clock. Divide a paper into six sections using three straight lines. Print or type and paste each of the following events in sequential order in a clockwise direction: Jesus Enters Jerusalem (Palm Sunday) (Mark 11:7-11), The last Supper (Holy Thursday) (Mark 14:22-26), Jesus' Death (Good Friday) (Mark 15:33-41), Christ's Resurrection (Easter Sunday) (John 20:1-9), Christ's Ascension (Acts 1:1-11), and Pentecost (Acts 2:1-11). As each event passes during the Holy Week through Pentecost color each section when it happens.

If we give children a little extra preparation, they can grow into an appreciation of just how tremendous Holy Week and the Fifty Days of Easter are while we are creating wonderful memories about how their families celebrated the Easter season. Have fun making those memories! They will live forever!

#### **Gospel Jn 12:20-33**

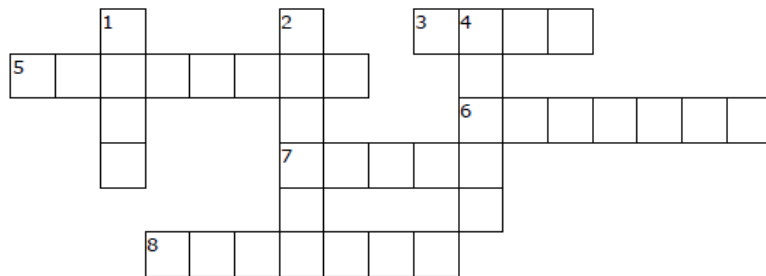

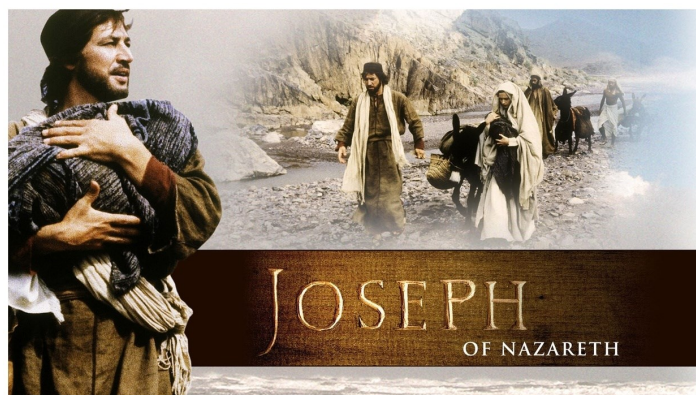

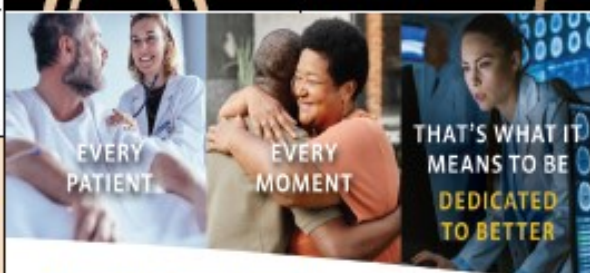
