THE CHURCH IS OPEN 6 AM TO 6 PM

Daily Mass can be viewed on staidanparish.org, Facebook and Vimeo. The faithful are required to attend Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation Masses. This obligation does not apply to those who are ill, those who are confined to their home, a hospital, or nursing facility, or those with serious underlying health conditions.

CONFESSION

Confessions are available in the church on Saturday from 12:30 PM to 1:30 PM and 4:00 PM to 5:00 PM. You can also make an appointment with a priest by calling the rectory office.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

First and Third Fridays of the month 1:00-3:00 PM in the church.

COMMUNION TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND

To bring communion to the sick and home bound you must be a commissioned Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist who has completed diocesan training. Communion outside a church is to be carried in a pyx. Before Mass begins leave your pyx on the tray beside the sacristy door. You can collect the pyx at the end of Mass. Do not fill your pyx in

the communion line. If you were unable to leave your pyx on the tray before Mass, just go to the sacristy at the end of Mass and ask the sacristan or priest for communion. If you know of someone homebound who would like to receive Communion from a Eucharistic Minister, please contact the Rectory.

BAPTISM

To arrange a baptism contact the rectory office. Forms need to be completed giving information on the parents, child's date and place of birth, as well as the names and religious affiliation of the sponsors. At least one sponsor must be a practicing Catholic. Baptisms are held on the 1st Sunday and 3rd Sunday at 1:30 PM. To hold a private baptism you must first make arrangements with a priest or deacon to perform the baptism and then contact the Rectory Office to check if the church is available. First time parents are required to attend a Baptism Class. Classes are held in the church on the second Sunday of the month after the 12 PM Mass. Parents are asked to gather at St. Joseph's statue to the right of the altar.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Anointing of the sick takes place at 1:00 PM on the 4th Sunday of each month. Please wait for the priest at Our Lady's Shrine.

MARRIAGE

Arrangements are to be made at the Rectory office at least 9 months in advance. Pre-Cana and FOCCUS registrations must be arranged. Pre-Cana at St. Aidan consists of a ONE DAY SATURDAY COURSE. The moderator is Deacon Rudy Martin: Dcrudy@Staidanparish.org. Information on the Pre-Cana Course offered by the Diocese of Rockville Center can be found at www.drvc-faith.org or call 678-5800 ext. 223.

Forgiving Father



What's Pastor Thinking

That younger son in today's gospel had done the unthinkable in the culture of Jesus' day. He had brazenly asked for his share of the inheritance before his father died. That was one offense. And, in spite of the inappropriateness of the request, the father granted it, giving his son what he had asked for. And then the son committed his second offense: he took what Dad had given him and left home. He might just as well have declared, 'My father is dead!' He squandered his money wastefully, living only for the moment, with no thought to the future, no thought that his money might actually run out. But it did run out. And then there was a famine. He got a job, a demeaning job for a Jew, feeding pigs. But he was hungry, so hungry, he would have eaten the pigs' leftovers. He's desperate. He's desperate, and he hatches another plan to take care of himself. He believes he can't go home

again, at least not as a son. But maybe his father will give him a job, as a hired hand; at least, then, he'll have a way of supporting himself! So he heads down the long road toward his father's house. When he gets there, he plans to plead with his father, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of the hired hands.' Now, all this time, the father had been waiting. As much as he hurt, he wanted his child back home. Every day, several times a day, Dad would step out on the porch, eyes shaded against the sun, and look off into the distance, hoping against hope to see some sign of his son. He cried a million tears, figured his son must be dead, and wouldn't eat or sleep for days on end, that's how much he missed the boy. Just like God. With God, there is a standing invitation to those who have wandered away: 'Come home!'

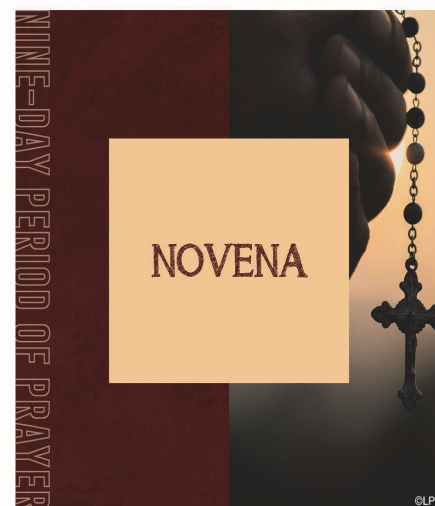

HOW TO REGISTER FOR LITURGICAL MINISTER TRAINING.
Please contact Fr. Adrian if you are interested in becoming trained as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and/or Lector. A letter must be sent from Fr. Adrian to Bishop Barres requesting the training.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF HOLY COMMUNION: PART A - This training is required for all those who are beginning as Ministers. This "BASIC" training is required for all Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. Those who wish to minister in hospitals, nursing homes and to the homebound are required to attend Part B training in addition to BASIC training. One must attend Part A training prior to Part B training.

OCIA stands for Order of Christian Initiation for Adults. It is a process by which adults can inquire about the Catholic Church. There is never any pressure put on any inquirer to become a Catholic. If an inquirer or seeker decides to move closer toward becoming a Catholic, he/she receives instruction in a small setting guided by a team of dedicated parishioners. The inquirer decides if he/she wants to move forward one step at a time. The whole parish family supports this process through prayer and witness. Those who choose to become Catholic are welcomed into the Church through the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. GETTING MARRIED IN CHURCH

At the time of your engagement, the Church welcomes you to this sacrament of Marriage in the spirit of Jesus who said: "This is my commandment: love one another as I love you." (John 15:12-13).

- Contact and meet with your parish priest as soon as you are engaged. Take at least one year to prepare for your

marriage. This goes beyond choosing a date and church, reserving a place for the reception, and picking out dresses. It means using this time to delve more deeply into your relationship and approach this momentous day with prayer and reflection.

- Attend an approved marriage preparation program. Catholic marriage preparation programs are usually presented by a team of lay married couples and a priest or deacon. They are not restricted to Catholics, but they are always in keeping with Church teaching.
- Most dioceses ask couples to take a marriage preparation inventory (such as FOCCUS). These are not “tests” to determine whether you can get married in the Church, but rather discussion starters to assess what issues you already agree on and what you might need to discuss further.

LITURGY COLUMN

Up to this point, the 22nd Session of Trent dealt with things of a mostly liturgical nature which the Protestant Reformation got wrong, and how seriously the Church would deal with them. Then immediately following all those Canons, the Council investigated areas where the Protestants' claims did have some validity in pointing out some practices which were in need of correction. First, there is a section entitled DECREE CONCERNING THE THINGS TO BE OBSERVED, AND TO BE AVOIDED, IN THE CELEBRATION OF MASS. This consists of three paragraphs dealing with some of those things identified by the Reformation which clearly needed to be fixed. The language is, as usual, very flowery and drawn out, but the gist of these reforms is as follows. The first paragraph has the usual line of reasoning; since the Mass and the central sacrifice is so sacred and is all based on scripture, it must be celebrated in a holy manner by priests who are beyond reproach. Specifically, there shall be no covetousness, impiety, any taint of idol worship, irreverence, or simony (the buying or selling of ecclesiastical offices). The next paragraph covers who shall be allowed to preach, notably only a priest approved by local bishop ensuring that he is properly credentialed. It also enjoins some types of overly ornate music, extraneous noise or profane conversation, anything lascivious, and unnecessary walking around. The final paragraph forbids any kind of superstitious rites or practices, several of which are listed, and

encourages the people to attend Mass in their own local church, especially for the most important feasts and Sundays. All of this seems obvious to us today, but the Church was rightly challenged by the Reformation for being guilty of them at that time, and so the Church correctly addressed them here in summary fashion.

How the corrections necessary for the proper internal reform of the Church would be accomplished is covered in the next section, the DECREE ON REFORMATION. There are eleven chapters which go over the remedies in great detail, and the Council very clearly orders that these reforms be carried out.

Between these two major sections of the document, the Council dealt with many, if not all, of the issues raised by the Protestant Reformation relative to the celebration of the Mass, and identified where the Protestants were wrong and where they were right. They clearly laid out how to address the issues, either fixing what needed to be fixed, or repudiating claims that were incorrect. And the Council demonstrated how serious were the fundamental theological and liturgical issues in which the Church was correct in how those who refused to accept this would be treated. They would be excommunicated. There was no middle ground.

Finally, there is one more short section, DECREE TOUCHING THE PETITION FOR THE CONCESSION OF THE CHALICE, consisting of only one paragraph in which there is a bit of compromise.

There is a very long story behind this. The Church had long debated, for both theological and cultural reasons, whether or not the Blood of Christ should be distributed as part of the Eucharist, and if so, to the laity, or if the Mass was concelebrated, only to the main celebrant. It became important politically especially after the Reformation. This section of the 22nd session does not fully resolve the issue, but with little enthusiasm, says it is up to the local Bishops. This was at least partly to keep some Catholics faithful to the Church in Protestant areas where it was a very popular issue. Accordingly, on April 16, 1564, Pius IV finally decided to grant the chalice to the Empire, or more precisely, to empower the bishops to allow or forbid the chalice in their dioceses, according to their judgment.

Subsequently, again in accordance with the decrees of the Council of Trent, Pope Pius V in 1570 enforced use of the Tridentine Mass in the Roman Catholic Church and made his revision of the Roman Missal mandatory throughout the Church, permitting continuance of other rites only if they had been in existence for at least 200 years. This was a bow to the Ambrosian rite, the suppression of which had caused riots in the previous century. All other rites disappeared. Hence the Tridentine Mass became the norm, and aided by European colonization, it spread all over Asia, Africa, and the Americas, making it the standard Catholic Mass until Vatican II.

CONNECTING CHURCH AND HOME:

Today's Gospel is particularly attractive since it is centered on two brothers who have very different responses to their Father's expectations. There are many children's trade books centered on this gospel story precisely because it's so real to family life highlighting the dynamic between parents and children; however, loving, wise parents are always waiting and trying to enable their children to see the light and change their ways for the better. The Father, relieved, excited, welcoming, compassionate, and forgiving awaits his child with joy. This is our story as parents and families when we try to

lead our children to find the light of God ever present in their lives. A great reinforcement activity with younger children would be to let them visit the Reconciliation Room. Explain what goes on and how this special room gives people an opportunity to tell God they are sorry for their sins just like the younger son in the story asked the Father for forgiveness. Another fun activity is to cut out a large size paper heart and then some small squares of different colors. Talk about how God reaches out to us in love, welcomes us, forgives us, and celebrates with us. Glue one of the small squares in the heart for every idea children come up about how they can show God's love to others. This mosaic heart could be continued throughout Lent and displayed in a place of honor in the home for Easter. To the rhythm of Pat-a-Cake, teach younger children this rhyme: I love you, and you love me, and that's the way that it should be; so I forgive, and you

do too, because you love me, and I love you. Do a little role playing with school-age children acting out the basics of this gospel and then discussing what would you do? This helps children process the beauty of this story as they place themselves in the positions of both brothers. With older children, help them through guided discussion to see and analyze the actions of both of the brothers and then the Father's response. Older children are developmentally more disposed to recognizing other points of view. Some great insights can come to light!

Because we have free will, we can choose to look at our choices and confidently go to God, who never gets tired or reaching out to us. What a blessing! This is the perfect season for the Sacrament of Reconciliation for families. Remember, in this gospel story, celebration followed the act of repentance. Celebrating God's boundless love for us is beyond awesome!

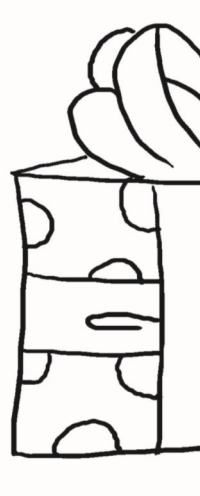

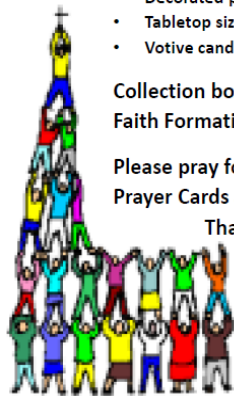

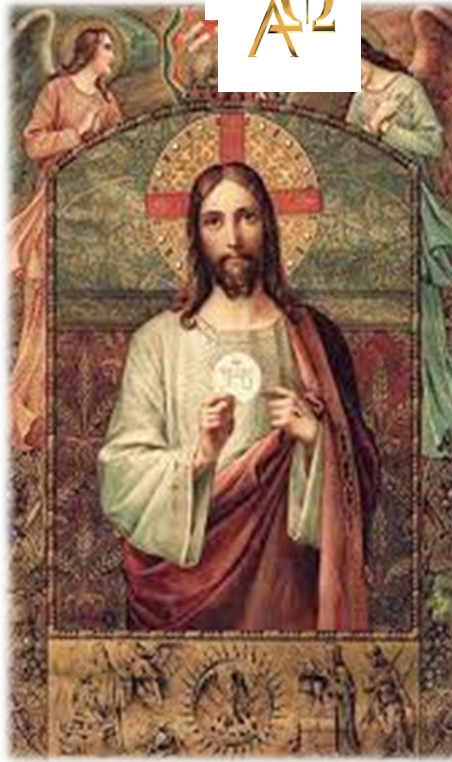

MARCH 30 FOURTH SUNDAY LENT

Reading I Jos 5:9a, 10-12

The LORD said to Joshua, "Today I have removed the reproach of Egypt from you." Reading II 2 Cor 5:17-21

Brothers and sisters: Whoever is in Christ is a new creation: the old things have passed away; behold, new things have come. And all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the ministry of reconciliation, namely, God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting their trespasses against them and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. So we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who did not know sin, so that we might become the righteousness of God in him.

Gospel Lk 15:1-3, 11-32

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them Jesus addressed this parable: "A man had two sons, and the younger son said to his father, 'Father give me the share of your estate that should come to me.' So the father divided the property between them. After a few days, the younger son collected all his belongings and set off to a distant country where he squandered his inheritance on a life of dissipation. When he had freely spent everything, a severe famine struck that country, and he found himself in dire need. So he hired himself out to one of the local citizens who sent him to his farm to tend the swine. And he longed to eat his fill of the pods on which the swine fed, but nobody gave him any. Coming to his senses he thought, 'How many of my father's hired workers have more than enough food to eat, but here am I, dying from hunger. I shall get up and go to my father and I shall say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you. I no longer deserve to be called your son; treat me as you would treat one of your hired workers."' So he got up and went back to his father. While he was still a long way off, his father caught sight of him, and was filled with compassion. He ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him. His son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you; I no longer deserve to be called your son.' But his father ordered his servants, 'Quickly bring the finest robe and put it on him; put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Take the fattened calf and slaughter it. Then let us celebrate with a feast, because this son of mine was dead, and has come to life again; he was lost, and has been found.' Then the celebration began. Now the older son had been out in the field and, on his way back, as he neared the house, he heard the sound of music and dancing. He called one of the servants and asked what this might mean. The servant said to him,

'Your brother has returned and your father has slaughtered the fattened calf because he has him back safe and sound.' He became angry, and when he refused to enter the house, his father came out and pleaded with him. He said to his father in reply, 'Look, all these years I served you and not once did I disobey your orders; yet you never gave me even a young goat to feast on with my friends. But when your son returns who swallowed up your property with prostitutes, for him you slaughter the fattened calf.' He said to him, 'My son, you are here with me always; everything I have is yours. But now we must celebrate and rejoice, because your brother was dead and has come to life again; he was lost and has been found.'"

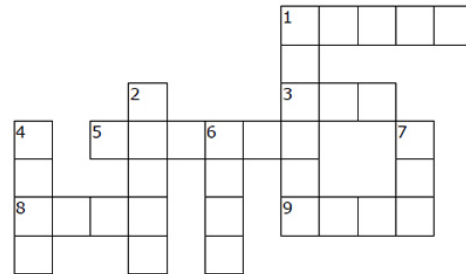

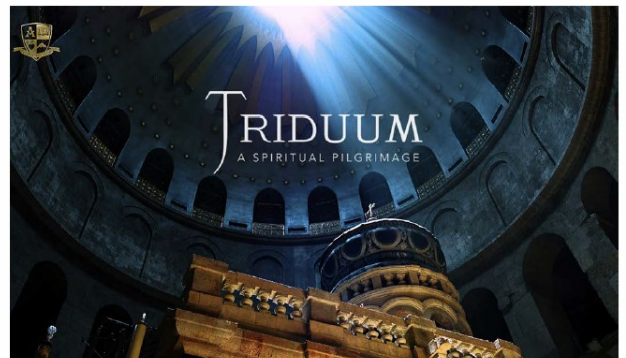
