

THIS WEEK IN FAITH FORMATION we're learning about Sacred Scripture. Sacred Scripture is the word of God: it is the Bible, which is comprised of the Old Testament and the New Testament. We come to learn who God is and how He loves us through the Old Testament. Yet, as we read through the Old Testament, we can see time and again how many of us fail to hear God's voice clearly, and we turn away from Him. Through this experience of a fractured relationship with man over time, God sends us His Son, Jesus Christ, to be the full revelation of God to man. The New Testament is the part of the Bible from Jesus joining man here on Earth. The Bible was not handed to the apostles by Jesus. Did you know the Church existed hundreds of years before the Bible? The New Testament was written after Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension. The books of the Bible were written by many different authors inspired by God who had different purposes for their writings, like historical, wisdom, or prophetic teaching. The Council of Rome in 382 A.D. established the canon (list) of books to be included in the Bible, taking teaching scrolls from the Jewish faith to comprise the forty-six books of the Old Testament, and taking letters, history, and gospels to comprise the twentyseven books of the New Testament. This scriptural canon was reaffirmed through several more councils, and most notably at the Council of Trent in 1546 A.D. in response to the Protestant Reformation. Our Bible has seven more books than Protestant Bibles because we have included more scrolls from the Jewish faith which were not commonly used by European Jews at the time of the Protestant Reformation, leading Protestant reformers to remove this apocrypha of seven books from the Bible. Catholic Bibles also differ from Protestant Bibles because our Bibles have footnotes to provide parallels and explanations for us to better understand scripture. Do you have a Bible in your home? Where do you keep it? When do you use it? The more we spend time in the word, the more we spend time with our Lord.
