

Dear Beloved People of Divine Savior and our cherished visitors:

This Sunday’s Gospel begins with another reminder that Jesus is continuing His journey to Jerusalem. This is a very important detail given that the tension between Jesus and the leaders of the Jewish people are getting more intense as Jesus invites and challenges them to change many of their values and actions. Given that Jesus put out some rather drastic suggestions for changes in the economic system in the last several weeks, we can easily imagine that the occupying Roman Empire is anything but thrilled with Jesus.

That Jesus continues His journey quite aware of what awaits Him in Jerusalem is a call to us to renew our commitment to do all we can to help transform our own lives as well as the dysfunctional and debilitating systems that cause so many of us to experience on-going concern and anxiety about what is going on in our country and in many parts of the world. We realize that, if we push too energetically against these trends that need to be transformed, we might find ourselves in the position Jesus did. Do we, like Him, continue to push for change regardless of the consequences we might suffer, or do we pull back and hope things will change without our efforts?

This Gospel passage about the ten lepers is quite familiar to us. Everybody plays by the rules of the day for the first two scenes. Lepers were to remain at a distance from all the other people for two reasons; one, because of their sores they were considered unclean and not fit to be a part of the regular community. Two, fear that their ailment was contagious was another reason for them to keep their distance. Jesus does His part by sending them to the priests who, if they were going to be healed, would vouch for that and allow them to return to community participation. We see the confidence of Jesus on display as His mere sending them to the priests and their faith in Jesus their Master was enough to bring about their healing.

In the culture of Jesus’ time, saying “thank you” meant that whatever one offered thanks for would be the last interaction between those folks. The Samaritan knew that was the case for him and so expressed his gratitude; his doing so gave Jesus the opportunity to affirm him and his faith. That Jesus asked where the other nine were might very well have been Jesus way of calling for another change in their culture, that expressing thanks is the human thing to do and to forget the culture that in this case held that Jesus could to say to the nine, “look, I did you a favor, and now it is time for you to do one for me.” Given Jesus’ affirming the faith of the Samaritan leads us to think that Jesus wanted people to realize that people doing good for one another is a sign of how good God is to us, and that God will not demand anything from us except to multiply the good out of gratitude for God’s blessing.

That same understanding is made clear as Elisha in our first reading does not accept a gift from Naaman who followed Elisha’s direction by which Naaman was healed of his ailment. Elisha wanted Naaman to take seriously God’s goodness that brought the healing, for which Elisha, like Jesus, was an instrument.
