

Dear Beloved People of Divine Savior and our cherished visitors:

Our Scripture passages focus on imagery about how the world might end. As we know only too well, some people interpret this kind of writing literally. Some get so excited by this imagery that they do their best consciously or unconsciously to help move the process along, thinking that they will be among those who are saved while they have the so-called honor to watch the bad (in their mind) people suffer most gruesomely.

Jesus calls us to look into our hearts and ask some serious and deep questions. One is, "why would God destroy what He created?" When we look at the millions of years of the universe's existence and see the amazing development over those years, isn't it possible to imagine that the Holy Spirit will gradually lead us all into an entirely different realm called the Kingdom of Heaven?

Sometimes positive change can be just as or even more frightening than all the destruction depicted in these readings. This certainly seems to be the case with all those who oppose Pope Francis. They appear to think that he is a divisive element in the church when actually he is dedicating his life to have all of us see one another as the beloved children of God, including those we otherwise might think of as sinners who are to be rejected and cast aside.

People accuse him of destroying sacred traditions when all he is doing is seeing if there are ways for more people to experience the great celebration of the Mass. Some simply think he is on the wrong track. While Pope Francis might not be perfect, he is doing his best to bring as many people as possible into the faith community Jesus established. Wasn't Jesus condemned by the legalistic and tradition-bound people of His day for doing something quite similar?

Change of any kind can be very unsettling. We are called to look at possibilities by which people can be welcomed into the community with the goodness in our hearts and intuition; we are asked to consider whether some dogmas, traditions and rules have outworn their usefulness. Instead of arguing or finding fault, perhaps it is time to let the Holy Spirit within us empower us to let the love of God lead us to find ways to be as inclusive as possible, again providing the opportunity for people to be welcomed with the conviction that once welcomed and surrounded by a loving community any realities that are actually not of benefit to an individual or to a community have a better chance of being changed.

Jesus says that many will come in His name. We know only too well that some people, for whatever reason, have a false or distorted image of Jesus and God. Through it all, Jesus reminds us that whatever confusion, disorder, chaos, and destructive behavior that is taking place, we are the ones, rooted in the love of God, who are to give testimony to the truth of God's love.

Jesus reminds us not to prepare beforehand, but again to be focused on the indwelling of God's Word, grace and wisdom that all of those who oppose us will be powerless to resist or refute. Jesus uses the corny image that not a hair on our head will be destroyed as we act out of the promise that the Truth of God's love will set all people free.

**Giving Garden Update**

The 9 garden beds built are just about done with their giving. There are still some tomatoes and butternut squash to harvest. The volunteers have grown pounds of cucumbers, close to 200 squash, melons and lots of tomatoes. They have finished the walkways and the main driveway to make the area more accessible. Here are some of the other things accomplished:

- Tested soil (negative for lead) and secured fencing.
- Leveled and trenched ground, installed irrigation system.
- Received donations for garden equipment and compost bins.
- Involved over 40 parishioners
- Held parish open house; had children tour garden and plant flowers to beautify the area.

Right now leaves are being added to the compost bins to prepare a good amendment for the beds. This will make next year's harvest even better. So the composting effort will continue through the winter. Leaves (except oak leaves) are being accepted by placing them in bags near the bin by the light post. Thanks for any help you can give!
