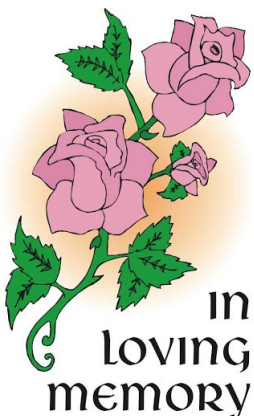
Trunk or Treat - On Sunday, our Faith Formation team, staff and volunteers provided

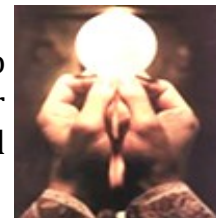
