The parable in today's Gospel has been interpreted in at least two very different ways. One version is that we all ought to accept the gifts and talents that we received from God and to do our best to put them to use to bring about as much good as possible. We know that when we engage in this kind of behavior, we often tend to realize, or others help us to realize, that we have talents and gifts that we might not have been aware of. In this line of thinking, the third servant misjudged the master, which some people still do with God. The servant acted out of fear and therefore ended up with nothing and was thrown out into the darkness.
