Dear Loving God of Us All:

We are renewed as we reflect that many years before the birth of Jesus people were quite aware of Your characteristics as are reflected in this weekend's Psalm. We ponder these words and phrases: gracious, merciful, slow to anger, of great kindness, and compassionate; we pray that we allow Your grace and love to help us grow in these same characteristics.

This is one way we can be more faithful to the command Jesus reminds us of in this weekend's Gospel: "love one another." We pray that in the process of our reflection, we can realize more clearly that every person is created in Your image and endowed with these characteristics. We give thanks to You, O Blessed Savior, for the example You set that shows us how to see one another as Your sisters and brothers. We promise to forego any thoughts of what we think we know of each other, regardless of what our ingrained prejudices might judge about one another, and regardless of what anybody else might think of others.

O Holy Spirit, remind us that Your wisdom is readily available to us to help us choose loving ways. This process can be difficult and challenging, to see ourselves and one another as the beloved and precious people we are and to interact with each other with that perspective. Through Christ Our Lord.

Dear Parishioners of Divine Savior and our cherished visitors:

Acts 14: 21-27; Ps 145:8-13; Rev 21:1-5a; John 13:31-33a, 34-35

When Jesus speaks of being glorified, one meaning of this reality is that Jesus is acknowledging that He has done all He could to reveal the love of God for all people. Like everything that has to do with love, glory is weaved in and through the relationship that God and the Word made flesh in Jesus have enjoyed from the beginning. We notice that God does not need any time to consider whether to glorify Jesus; God glorifies Him at once.

Of importance is that Jesus speaks these words during the Last Supper. Once Judas has left this celebration, Jesus is more certain than ever that His suffering, death, and Resurrection are about to take place. This is what Jesus is referring to when He tells the disciples that He will be with them only a little while longer. This, too, ties intricately with the reality that Jesus is glorified because of His faithfulness. Despite knowing of the great suffering and likely horrible death that He would face in a few hours, He continued the mission as faithfully as he had up until this point. Clear evidence of this is His not responding to His torturers with violence; love does not choose that path. Another clear instance is when Jesus welcomes into heaven the criminal who was crucified with Him who asks for Jesus' mercy.

Is there a possibility that we will experience glory? Jesus is quite clear that our path to glory is to love as He has loved. We might wonder how serious we are to be about loving. Jesus states that we are to love one another so that anyone with whom we relate will sense real evidence that we are truly imitating Jesus. A relationship based on God's loving relationship with us empowers us to bring about similar loving connections with others.

Our first reading displays the consequences of what real love can bring about: "they made a considerable number of disciples." After having done so, before leaving that area, Paul and Barnabas strengthened the spirits of these new disciples and encouraged them to persevere in the faith. These are additional signs of true love. Another sign of this love is that they were quite realistic in letting them know that if they did persevere, they might also undergo many hardships.

We, too, face hardships. The fear that can easily brew within us because of the uncertainties of life are moments when we can again reflect on how God's love always accompanies us as we do our best to cooperate with God in supporting one another.

Our second reading reminds us clearly that "God's dwelling is with the human race." While God's Presence continues to guide the development of all creation, we are reassured that God also is with us personally, intimately, with utmost care, to the point of wiping every tear from our eyes.
