Amos 8: 4-7, Psalm 113: 1-2, 4-6, 7-8, 1 Timothy 2: 1-8,

Luke 16: 16:1-13 | The Parable of the Dishonest Steward

In our Gospel reading for today, we heard the Parable of the Dishonest Steward. This parable is one of the most challenging to interpret.

Perhaps, the primary question most people have about this parable is, what does Jesus mean when He says, "make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings?" What exactly is Jesus talking about?

So, the first clue to understanding this parable, and the others, is that it has an unexpected element. That is, this unexpected element is often the key that helps us unlock the teaching of the story.

Today's parable is placed right after the story of the prodigal son because this man is a prodigal steward. And by "prodigal" I mean someone who is a wasteful man, like the prodigal son. So, just as in the story of The Prodigal Son, this parable ends with a shocking and an unexpected element.

Now let us walk through it together. The first point to highlight here is the two characters in the parable. One is a very wealthy man. And the other character is a steward. He is the one who oversees the administrative matters of the rich man. Then, when the rich man comes back, he hears that his steward is wasting his money.

Just as in the parable of the prodigal son, here there is a prodigal steward who is wasting not his father's money but his master's money. So, what does the rich man do? He does not perform an official inspection of financial accounts and records. On the contrary, he tells him to prepare a full account of his stewardship. Then, what does the steward do? Remember, he is losing everything. He summons the people in debt to his master. What is going on here? He is securing his place with the rich and the powerful because he needs a place to go when he loses everything. And these people will remember the favors.

As we reach the shocking end of the story, we learn that the rich man realizes the dishonest plan of his steward, but he does not fire him, instead he praises him for securing his future. What is Jesus teaching us here? Here is a real situation, a story we can relate to very easily.

Jesus is comparing the children of this world with the children of light. The children of this world are consumed with the things of this world like the dishonest steward, who only thought of securing his place in this world. In contrast, the children of the light are those who do the will of God and fulfill His commandments.

So, what can we learn from today's Gospel? Jesus is teaching us that if many people in this world take extreme measures to secure their future in this world, how much more should Christians take extreme measures to prepare and secure their future in the Kingdom of Heaven?

I understand that securing your future financially is important. But what kind of spiritual investment have you made? How much have you thought about your spiritual future? And what are you doing with your spiritual wealth that has been entrusted to you? That is what the parable is all about. Today's Gospel is a memorable way of getting us to wake up and to start thinking about our spiritual investment. Amen.


