# Fr. Octavio Trejo-Flores, S.D.S.

### Luke 20: 27-38 | The Ouestion About the Resurrection

Our Gospel reading for today takes us to a subject about which many people have questions. Mainly, what happens after we die? And so, let us unpack together the context of the teaching of Jesus on the resurrection of the dead.

But before that, it is important to understand who the Sadducees were. They were one of the leading groups of the Jewish people in the first-century AD. Although they were a small group, they were very influential because they were tied to the Temple and to the priesthood.

Now, you might be wondering why the Sadducees asked Jesus about the resurrection of the dead. Unlike the Pharisees, who believed in the resurrection of the dead, the Sadducees saw no basis in an afterlife and held to the law of Moses as their sole source of authority.

The Evangelist Luke tells us that the Sadducees approached Jesus and presented Him with a situation based on the book of Deuteronomy: "The Levirate Rule." Under the law of Moses, a Levirate Rule was a type of marriage in which the brother, or male relative of a deceased, had the obligation to marry his brother's widow. So, the brother of a deceased man can serve as protection for the widow and her children, ensuring that they have a male provider and protector.

It should be noted that the Sadducees' question was not intended for educational purposes. On the contrary, their intention was to mock the idea of the resurrection. That is, they presented Jesus a possible situation where a widow was married to seven brothers who consecutively died and then the woman died. And they asked Jesus, "who did this woman belong to in the next life?"

So, what is Jesus' response? Let us keep in mind that the Sadducees intended not only to mock the resurrection of the dead, but also to objectify women. Jesus saw through their dishonest question.

And so, Jesus answered them on their own terms, but at the same time, He sought to raise their minds to heavenly truths. That is, Jesus presented a summary statement of His teaching. Then, in order to support His teaching, Jesus quoted the Torah itself (Cf. Luke 20: 37; Exodus 3:6), which was the only authority they accepted.

But Jesus did more. He stated that life after the resurrection is not a continuation of our earthly life. That is, once a person has risen from the dead, he/she belongs to the kingdom of His heavenly Father. So, God, the Father, not only gives life on earth, but also, He sustains and transforms life beyond death. Jesus Christ has already defeated death. So, we, the children of God, no longer die because "for to Him all are alive" (Cf. Luke 20:36-38). We, the children of God, experience the same life Jesus has.

Our security is based not on relationships of this life, but on our relationship to God, based upon our faith in Him through our Divine Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.

Dear Divine Savior Parishioners,

I am writing you regarding the construction of a fence around our campus. A few years ago, the Diocese of Sacramento recommended all parishes participate in a security and threat assessment. As a result of this study, it was determined that our campus had high-risk security and safety issues. To address these issues, the most effective solution was determined to be fencing the perimeter of the property.

Subsequently, we were made aware of a security grant available to non-profit organizations. With the efforts of a dedicated parishioner, we were able to apply for and secure this grant in the maximum amount of \$200,000.

Our hope is this fencing will help address and prevent future desecration, damage and vandalism to our property, while providing a more secure campus.

We anticipate the completion of this project by Christmas and further information will be shared regarding how this might affect the daily function of our parish community.

We continue our commitment to ensuring a community where all are welcome and safe.
