#### Fr. Octavio Trejo-Flores, S.D.S.

Matthew 3:1-12 | The Preaching of John the Baptist

In our Gospel reading for this Second Sunday of Advent we heard that the Evangelist Matthew introduces us to an important character in God's plan of salvation for us: John the Baptist. God gave John the mission of announcing the good news about the arrival of the Messiah.

Notice, it seems that in today's Gospel, the name of Jesus is not mentioned at all. However, Matthew is talking about Jesus the whole time because the primary reason for the preaching of John the Baptist is about Jesus.

And so, I would like to comment on a couple of key elements about today's Gospel. Number one, who was John the Baptist? He was the son of Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary's cousin, which means that he was related to Jesus. You might also remember that in the Gospels, Jesus states that John the Baptist is the greatest of all prophets. But why did Jesus say that?

Many of you know that John the Baptist prepared the people of Israel for the arrival of the Messiah. And when Jesus finally appeared, John was given the exclusive privilege of being the only prophet to announce that the Messiah had come. So, John the Baptist was not only an important character in Jesus' time for the people of Israel, but also the role that John played was fundamental to God's divine plan of salvation.

And number two: what was the message of John the Baptist? And why is it so important? John's primary message was: "repentance" and "the kingdom of heaven."

In Jesus' day, when the Jewish people heard the preaching of John, they would go back to the prophecies of the Old Testament. And Matthew tells us which prophet: "as it is written in the book of ... the prophet Isaiah." (Cf. Mt 3: 3). So, John's audience understood that he was referring to the image of preparing a path through the desert.

In other words, it is an image of the Exodus. When the people of Israel were set free and they journeyed through the wilderness, home to the Promised Land. That was the first Exodus in the time of Moses.

According to the prophets, one day in the age of Salvation, God would perform a new Exodus where God would save His people again. And so, John the Baptist is preaching the coming of the new Exodus.

You may wonder why the river Jordan. In the Old Testament, the first Exodus ended at the river Jordan, when the people of Israel crossed through the waters of the river Jordan and entered in the promise land. (Cf. Joshua 4-5).

So, John the Baptist goes back to the place where the first Exodus ended, and he says the new Exodus is now to begin. The good news of the coming of the kingdom of God. And it is not just about going to heaven after we die, but the fulfillment of all the prophecies of God to His people being fulfilled in the new coming in this new and glorious kingdom. A new Exodus, a new Promised Land.

So, we, like John the Baptist, we have to be heralds of the Messiah and proclaim the good news of God. And what is the Good News? God has saved us thanks to the merits of our Divine Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen.


