#### FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

To foster a spirit of repentance and unite ourselves more closely to Christ, Church law requires the observance of Abstinence and Fasting (CIC - Code of Canon Law, 1249-1253) during Lent.

- 1. Abstinence: All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. When considering your meals, keep in mind that only fish and shellfish are not considered meat. Beef, pork, chicken and turkey are meat.
- **2. Fasting:** Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is generally understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten, but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted. Airport workers, travelers, and others while on board ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fast and abstinence for the duration of their journey (except on Good Friday). It is desirable that they perform some other pious act instead.

Those that are excused from fast and abstinence outside the age limits include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women.



# Fr. Octavio Trejo-Flores, S.D.S.

Matthew 5: 38-48 | Love Your Enemies

Our Gospel reading for today is a challenging one for us. We heard that Jesus says: "love your enemies." (Cf, Mt. 5: 44a). I think that the immediate reaction that people probably had back then, in which I know people might have today, was "how can I love someone who has done evil to me? And so, what does Jesus mean by that?"

I think that this statement is probably difficult to comprehend for us as modern people because in modern English language the word "love" has become so wrapped up with our emotions, our passions, and our feelings toward another person or things. For example, when we say: "we love someone," what we mean is that we have good feelings towards somebody. So, there is an emphasis on feelings when we talk about love. To say nothing of the fact that love is often associated with romantic love.

Now, how can we have romantic love for our enemies? I mean, it makes no sense, does it? But Jesus is not using the word "love" in the way that we would use it with the primary emphasis on a connotation of feelings.

So, exactly, how does Jesus want us to love? What are the actions that would express love? If we look, Jesus unpacks what loving your enemies looks like with very specific instructions.

First, loving my enemies implies good actions. So, if we love an enemy, we will do good to someone who hates us. Even though they hate us, we don't return evil with evil. That is, if they give us evil, we return it with a good action: love. So, the first way we show love for our enemies is to do good to them. It doesn't say anything about my feelings, the emphasis is on actions.

Another way to do good to others is "to pray for those who persecute you." (Cf, Mt. 5: 44b). Perhaps you may be wondering, how can I pray for a person who has treated me cruelly or unfairly? But my friends, even if we don't get into contact with someone who is an enemy or who hates us, we can always pray for them.

And so, what is a prayer? A prayer is for God to bless a person. So, we are asking for good to be done to someone who wishes evil to us. That is also loving our enemies. It might sound contradictory, but Jesus is asking us to pray for those who hate or mistreat us.

Frankly, we know that it is not going to come naturally to us. To say, this person that I know is an enemy, this person that I hate, I am going to spend some time in prayer. We don't wish to pray for people who betrayed us, or stole our jobs, or destroyed our life, or whatever it might be. So, to pray is an expression of love because it is to will good of another.

To act in such a way is to bring good to another. And it is not primarily rooted in our emotions. It is rooted in the will, it is rooted in the choices that we make: to do good, and to pray for our enemies.

Those are two things that Jesus is asking us to do in our Gospel reading for today, as He is teaching us how we should love our enemies. Amen.
