John 11: 1-45 | The Raising of Lazarus

Last weekend, the Evangelist John told us the story of the healing of the man born blind to demonstrate that Jesus Christ is "the light of the world." In our Gospel reading for the Fifth Sunday of Lent, John takes one of the greatest miracles of Jesus: The Raising of Lazarus, to show that Jesus is "the resurrection and the life."

It is possible that you may wonder why the Church chooses John's account of the raising of Lazarus for the last Sunday of Lent. And this is my honest answer. Because it is the conclusion of our Lenten journey before we enter into Holy Week.

And so, I would like to focus on a couple of themes that the Evangelist John addresses in our Gospel reading: suffering and death.

Firstly, let us begin by understanding why Jesus said that Lazarus' illness "is not to end in death." Jesus Himself gives the answer. That is, He says that He will use the death of His friend Lazarus as an opportunity to show the power of God. (Cf. Jn 11: 4).

Here, John shows one of Jesus' greatest miracles in all the Gospels, which is not recorded in the synoptic Gospels. And John wants to make sure that we know about the raising of Lazarus from the tomb. Why? Because it is "for the glory of God." (Cf. Jn 11: 4).

You might also wonder why Jesus waited two days longer to go to Judea. John says very specifically that Jesus did this because 'He loved Lazarus, Martha, and Mary.' (Cf. Jn 11: 3.5).

That is a very interesting statement, and perhaps it doesn't make any sense. But this is Jesus, and He is not an ordinary man, and He doesn't have an ordinary love for His friends. That is, Jesus allows Lazarus to suffer and die because He is going to bring him back from the tomb.

My friends, throughout the centuries many scholars have concluded that those who are especially dear to God, He allows them to suffer or even to die. As we see in the case of Lazarus. Possibly, some of you would say, Jesus must not love His friends because they are suffering or dying. But what the Evangelist John is revealing to us here is that those whom Jesus loves in a very especial way, He draws into the mystery of His Cross, which is the mystery of His own suffering.

The Evangelist also implies that Jesus doesn't diminish the reality and horror of suffering by redeeming it. Rather, He also participates fully in it and shows us that crying and mourning over the suffering and death of the world is natural because He Himself knows it. And as we read in this passage Jesus clearly feels the pain of the loss of His friend.

And yet, Jesus allows that His friend suffers and dies "for the glory of God, that the Son of God may be glorified through it." And so, "For Christ it was more important to conquer death than to cure disease. He showed his love for his friend not by healing him but by calling him back from the grave. Instead of a remedy for his illness, He offered him the glory of rising from the dead." (Cf. John Chrysologus, Sermon 63:1-2).

And so, as we celebrate the last Sunday of Lent, the Church is preparing us to celebrate the Passion of our Divine Savior, our Lord Jesus Christ. He shows His power over life and death in the raising of Lazarus to show us that He has the power to save us all. The raising of Lazarus is a sign that points forward to the resurrection of Christ that we will be celebrating on Easter Sunday. Amen.
