

John 6:51-58 | Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

A year ago, I was preparing my homily for today's feast, the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. So, I found a very interesting study on the number of Catholics in the U.S. who really believe that Jesus is truly present in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. According to that survey, just one-third of U.S. Catholics, about 31%, said they believe that "during Mass, the bread and wine actually become the body and blood of Jesus." (2019 Pew Research Center Survey)

In our Gospel reading for this Sunday, we read that Jesus said, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven... the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." But of course, people were scandalized and said, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" And also, some of Jesus' disciples were troubled by Jesus' words and some of them left.

It is possible that many of you are confused by Jesus' words too. But let me help you. John chapter six begins with the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves. After that, Jesus opens "The Bread of Life" discourse.

In the Gospel, we read that Jesus uses a metaphorical language to give us a statement. That is, the food that Jesus offers us is a food that "endures for eternal life." And this food, which is Himself, satisfies a much deeper need than to satisfy our appetite. The banquet that Jesus Christ offers us is His own body and His own blood. Jesus actually states that by eating His Body and drinking His blood, we may experience the fruit of His redemption.

The Gospel of John focuses on the "work" of God, which is Jesus Christ. The work of God in this world was to send the Son, Jesus, to save us all, and He did it. As Jesus patiently explained to the crowd, "whoever eats this bread will live forever."

Like the apostle Peter who said to Jesus, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God." Our response to Jesus is to love Him and have faith in Him.

And what we could achieve with this love and faith is to establish a relationship with God. And through this holy relationship with God, we can complete ourselves. That is, we can be in total unity with Him as His children. So, the bread and the wine transformed into Jesus Christ's body and blood "is the source and summit of the Christian life." (Cf. CCC 1324).

So, this weekend, let us be mindful of what we are celebrating. Let us look upon this Holy Sacrament with wonder and awe, and bring our sins, and even our doubts, and behold the very presence of Jesus Christ in this Sacrament of bread and wine, of the Body and Blood of our Divine Savior Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.



CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING SPRING SERIES . . .

This weekend we wrap up our Spring Social Justice series which has focused on the Seven Themes of Catholic Social Teaching. Even though this series is coming to an end, there is still much to be done in the realm of Social Justice and putting our faith into action!



This week our focus will be on the principle "Solidarity".

Catholic Social Teaching is rooted in the biblical belief that all people are created in the image and likeness of God and should be able to live as such. Jesus puts forth the principle of SOLIDARITY in his Sermon on the Mount. The Son of God tells the disciples that he himself is present in those who are hungry, thirsty or unclothed. (Matthew 25) When Pope St John XXIII said, "When one hurts, we all hurt" he expanded SOLIDARITY into a more global context. He reminded all people that countries depend on each other to prosper (encyclical Pacem in Terris)

Through the Catholic Worker Movement Dorothy Day for decades served the poorest individuals in daily efforts to obey Jesus's command, "Love one another as I have loved you." She believed that "God is love and perfect love casts out all fear.
