Matthew 21:28-32 | Re

In the Parable of the Two Sons, Jesus asks the chief priests and elders of the people a straightforward question: which is better, for a son to say he is going to do something and not do it, or a son who initially says he is not going to do something, but then turns around and does it in the end? We know the answer. It is better to do the deed in the end than to say you will and then not follow through. Words of good intention are empty if they do not lead to action.

The religious leaders, who had all the words of Scripture laid before them, did not accept that Jesus was the Messiah. So, while the vineyard was their own, they failed to act on the words they were given. Yet, those who had no words of promise uttered to them, no Messiah to claim, they were the ones who come streaming into the vineyard to claim Jesus as their saving one and follow Him as the Lord of their lives.

And so, the judgment of the parable is upon those who say one thing and do nothing about it. It is a necessary reminder for one who lives by words to acknowledge that words are sometimes not enough.

Surely, this is not only about a judgment on the religious leaders of Jesus' time. God is always at work among us. The question is whether you and I



notice and take notice. Who is the saving one for us? Will our words lead to action? Amen.

If you are anything like me, you may be wondering "what exactly is Eucharistic Revival and why do we need it?" When I think of the word 'revival' these words come to mind: enliven, rejuvenate, and renewal. If I liken these same words to my faith life, the concept of revival and the need for such makes sense to me. As a cradle Catholic, I must admit I have. at times, taken parts of my faith and tradition for granted, sometimes going through the motions, without perhaps giving due consideration to some of the gifts of my faith. Beginning October 1st through June 9th of 2024, our parish priests and staff, invite all of us to journey through this year of Eucharistic revival. To help us along the way, we have chosen for our parish the theme: Encountering Jesus through Communion. "What the world needs is God's love; it needs to encounter Christ and to believe in him. The Eucharist is thus the source and summit not only of the Church's life, but also of her mission."
