Matthew 22:34-40 | The Greatest Commandment

In our Gospel reading for today we read the Greatest Commandment. The story unfolds as follows. As Jesus is teaching His disciples how to love others, a scholar of the law asks Jesus a question. Not because he is interested in His teachings, but because he is interested to put Jesus to the test.

In this instance, Jesus provided the perfect response that silenced the scholar of the law who posed the question; Jesus replied to him: to "love God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. And love your neighbor as yourself." Jesus' statement offers a complete summary of the law that is embodied in the Ten Commandments.

So, what is the Greatest Commandment? It is love. And God is the source of love. We were created by God's love, so we were created to love and to be loved. In today's Gospel, Jesus is teaching us that it is essential for us to understand that God always loves us, no matter what.

It is true that sometimes, it is hard to accept and understand that God is the love of our life. sometimes, we just cannot love our neighbor as ourselves. I have heard people saying, "I just cannot forgive my husband, or wife, for forsaking me." "I just can't forgive my former friend for talking about me behind my back."

Jesus said that if we really understand the love of God, then we will know how to love our neighbor as ourselves. We can say with conviction that we love God. And, my friends, I have no doubt about it. But I would like to ask you, do you also love your neighbor as yourself? The true truth is that we all are called to love and to forgive because we have been loved and forgiven by God first.

Today, let us ask our heavenly Father to help us to welcome His love.



can love Him with all our heart. And also let us ask God to help us to love our neighbor as ourselves. Amen.


