FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

To foster a spirit of repentance and unite ourselves more closely to Christ, Church law requires the observance of Abstinence and Fasting (CIC - Code of Canon Law, 1249-1253) during Lent.

- 1. Abstinence: All persons, 14 years and older, are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. When considering your meals, keep in mind that only fish and shellfish are not considered meat. Beef, pork, chicken and turkey are meat.
- **2. Fasting:** Everyone from ages 18 to 59 is obliged to **fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. Voluntary fasting on other weekdays of Lent, especially on Wednesdays and Fridays, is highly recommended. Fasting is generally understood to mean that one full meal may be eaten. Two other small meals may be eaten, but together they should not equal a full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted.

When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, neither the law of fasting nor the law of abstinence obliges. If in doubt, one's parish priest or confessor should be consulted. Airport workers, travelers, and others while on board ships or airplanes are dispensed from the laws of fast and abstinence for the duration of their journey (except on Good Friday). It is desirable that they perform some other pious act instead.

Mark 1:12-15 | The Temptation of Jesus

We read in today's Gospel that Jesus is driven by the Spirit into the desert, and He is "tempted by Satan." After that, Jesus is back in the Galilee region preaching the kingdom of God.

However, let us go back a few verses. Mark tells us that Jesus came up from the waters of baptism in the Jordan River. And the Holy Spirit descended upon Him and a voice from heaven proclaimed: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." The gift of the Holy Spirit is not something that we are to simply hold on to and feel good about. Rather, the gift of the Holy Spirit is to empower us as disciples of our Divine Savior. It is a gift that is to move us out of our comfort zone. And as we read in the scripture, Jesus is driven into the desert by the Spirit.

Note that Mark does not suggest that Jesus did not choose to go to the desert, nor did He choose to be tempted. That is, being driven by the Spirit and being tempted by the devil were given to Him because there had to be room for free will, for a personal response once He found Himself there, but He did not choose this wilderness.

And so, what might this say to us as we begin our journey into this Lenten season? We have to understand that we did not create our own desert. We do not start a tough fight to impose all kinds of difficulties on ourselves to test our faith in God. Rather, we look around to see where the Holy Spirit has led us and where He is leading us, and most likely we will find that it is a wild enough place with enough voices of temptation without creating more.

Just as Jesus' wilderness experience was a testing of His baptismal call and identity, it could be that most of our Christian life is a testing and a living out of our baptismal call. Just as when the ashes are imposed, we are called to remember our mortality: "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The whole season of Lent is a call to remember that it is in God alone that we must find our identity. Amen.
