## Pastor's Corner...

The morning of the election we heard from Paul's letter to the Philippians at the daily liturgy. It was the familiar Philippians Canticle which ends, "*and every tongue confess that Jesus is Lord to the glory of God the Father.*" The reflection I read that morning tied Paul's message to the day. "*No matter how the election turns out, Jesus is Lord!*" As I write on Wednesday morning, we are still waiting on some states to report. What a reminder that in all the changing circumstances of life, outcomes we await, decisions we make, the TRUTH that is sure, never changing and always the same: Jesus is Lord!

The Gospel Story for this Sunday is a good one, often called the “Parable of the Wise and Foolish Virgins.” The wise virgins brought enough oil with them and their lamps were burning brightly when the bride groom came! The Church borrows this imagery for Baptism. The newly baptized is given a candle which is lit from the Easter Candle. The priest then instructs the parents and godparents, while commissioning the newly baptized, *“Receive the Light of Christ! Parents and godparents, this light has been entrusted to you to be kept burning brightly. Your child has been enlightened by Christ and is to always walk as a child of the Light. May they keep the flame of faith alive in their hearts, so that when the Lord comes, they will go out to meet him with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom.”* The Gospel reminds us to live our baptism and let the Lord shine brightly through us as a way of preparing to go out to meet him when he comes for us!

The first part of this year of catechesis for our 2nd graders has been devoted to the Sacrament of Reconciliation. These little hearts are continuing to learn that God is a loving and merciful Father, who sent us His Son Jesus, to forgive us. Christ's mercy from the cross continues to be poured out and celebrated by the Church in the beautiful Sacrament of Reconciliation. As these young people celebrate their First Reconciliation this week, they are taking a major step in preparation for their First Holy Communion. Lift up our 2nd graders in your prayers. This is a big year for them as they take their second step in the Sacraments of Initiation. Our 2nd graders are here to celebrate this milestone because their parents have kept the promise they made for them in baptism, to help them keep the flame of faith alive in their hearts. Thanks parents!



The Archdiocesan Campaign: [One Faith, One Family, One Future in Christ](#) is underway at Nativity. The campaign will fund 4 pillars of present need within the archdiocese. This week (on the following page) we highlight how the campaign will help care for our retired priests. When I see Fr. Al's picture associated with this pillar of the campaign, it's a good reminder that he has given 58 years in service to the People of God here in the Archdiocese – 20 of those years here at Nativity! You should have received a letter from me last week asking for your support. I am grateful to be able to make a gift to the campaign myself.

To date, the campaign has raised more than \$42 million towards the overall \$65 million archdiocesan goal. Nativity has been given a target goal of \$3.9 million. Twenty five percent of every dollar comes back to the parish. We hope Nativity will see the full possible rebate of \$982,500 coming back to the parish for needed capital projects on our campus. I am happy to report that our parish has raised more than \$2.2 million. We are at 58% of our goal with \$1.6 million left to raise. I am so pleased with what we have accomplished, especially in this unprecedented time! I want to say a special thank you to our parishioners who have generously supported the campaign with a gift and to our Campaign Co-Chairs, Leadership Committee and Ambassadors who have stepped forward with lots of enthusiasm and effort for the success of the campaign in our parish. If you have not already done so, join me and other Nativity parishioners in making a gift that will benefit both needs within the archdiocese and needs here at Nativity. Together, all of us supporting this campaign as we are able, I trust we can make our goal.

# ONE FAITH. ONE FAMILY. ONE FUTURE. IN CHRIST.

**One Faith, One Family, One Future in Christ** is an Archdiocesan-wide campaign to prepare the Church in Northeast Kansas for future generations of Catholics. Every family registered at Nativity should have received a letter from Fr. Mike regarding the campaign. Through this initiative we seek to build up four campaign pillars:

- ❖ Parishes, Schools, and Evangelization
- ❖ **Retired Priests**
- ❖ Villa St. Francis Skilled Nursing Facility
- ❖ Savior Pastoral Center



This week we highlight the **Retired Priests pillar**. Its key objectives are to:

- ❖ Honor and care for retired priests by fully funding the priest pension.
  - a. The retirement fund for our senior priests provides an income of approximately \$3,125 per month, which is not sufficient for securing living arrangements in retirement. The One Faith Campaign will make it possible to provide a modest increase in their monthly income.
  - b. The retirement and medical plans for priests have experienced a significant funding shortfall recently likely caused by a combination of a underfunding in annual contributions and investment losses during the past decade. Unfortunately, this is a common problem for organizations that sponsor a defined benefit pension plan. The One Faith Campaign will help make it possible for us to 'catch up' on its funding.
- ❖ Provide our senior priests with a residence where they can live in community with their brother priests in retirement.
  - a. A 12-unit independent living residence will be constructed on a 3.6 acre site to the west of the current Santa Marta Campus at 116th & Greenwood in Olathe, KS.
  - b. It will include a community area with a Chapel for celebrating Mass; a dining room; a kitchen; an exercise room; regular housekeeping; and one meal per day.
  - c. Each suite will offer a bedroom, living/dining room, kitchen, bath, patio, and laundry.
