

Pastor's Corner...



The Third Sunday of Advent is traditionally known as Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin, which means Rejoice! Today we light the rose-colored candle of the Advent Wreath, we wear the rose vestment, we hear the call “to rejoice” throughout today’s Scriptures, and we sing the hymn of the day, “O Come, O Come, Emmanuel.” It’s all about anticipatory Christmas Joy!

Our Responsorial refrain comes from the Blessed Mother and her Magnificat, “My soul rejoices in my God.” And St. Paul reminds us, “Rejoice always, never cease praying, render constant thanks.” Indeed, our homework we carry away from the liturgy this week is all about rejoicing. It’s such a good reminder in the midst of so many experiencing COVID fatigue, the blues, feeling isolated and restricted,

longing for a return to normalcy. And it’s right in the midst of our circumstance that we hear the call to rejoice! What’s good in your life? What gives you cause for joy? Rejoice and be grateful! Each of us is called to be a witness and minister of Christmas joy. Make a real effort to be that joy for your family, your friends, those with whom you work, those in need! Knowing Jesus in our lives is to make a difference. Does my attitude reflect that Christ dwells in me? Take the time to connect with the ‘source of all joy’ this week in prayer, Scripture and Eucharist.


Light the third candle on your wreath and in your heart this week. Let Christmas joy shine through you! Anticipate the Feast of Christmas by counting blessings, listening to music of the season, keeping a positive outlook. Have fun while wrapping gifts, sending cards, baking, Say *Thank You*. Say *I Love You*. Pay Compliments. Keep the Advent prayer close at hand, *Come, Lord Jesus!*

Last week, hearing about and seeing the goodness of our parishioners at work for others in need gave me reasons for rejoicing. Nativity Parish School led the annual Coat Drive, which brought in record number of coats for Catholic Charities to give away. We had lots of visitors to the office bringing in Angel Tree gift cards for Catholic Charities and Advice & Aid. Ways to Give To Nativity and Special Tax Opportunities In 2020

As yearend approaches, we would like to remind you of various ways you can contribute to the parish, which may also benefit you for tax purposes. According to IRS guidelines **contributions must be received no later than December 31, 2020** to be included on your 2020 tax statement from the church.

Appreciated Stock

A transfer of appreciated stock whether publicly traded, mutual fund, ETF or privately-held, all which need to have been owned for longer than one year, is an efficient way to contribute. You may receive a tax deduction based on the value of the stock on the date transfer and avoid paying tax on the appreciation from your cost basis. Please contact the business office for stock transfer instructions for Nativity's brokerage account.

Qualified Charitable Contribution from your IRA

After age 70 ½ annual withdrawals from your IRA are required. You can avoid income tax on the portion of your required minimum distribution donated to Nativity. The distribution must come directly from your IRA to Nativity. Consult your financial advisor or broker to set up a distribution.

Online Giving

Nativity offers online giving by credit card or ACH on a one-time or scheduled basis. Please visit the Online Giving option on our website, www.kcnativity.org located under Stewardship at the bottom of the home page.

New Charitable Contribution Limits

For those individuals who itemize deductions, the CARES Act removes the 60% of AGI limitation for most gifts to public charities, such as Nativity. This means you can offset up to 100% of your 2020 income with cash contributions. Contributions more than this amount can be carried forward for five years subject to the 60% AGI limit. For corporate donations, the limit is increased to 25% of taxable income from 10% previously. For those who do not itemize deductions, for 2020 you may take a new "above the line" deduction of \$300 for cash contributions.

What Is Special About The Third Sunday Of Advent?

For much of the Church's history, this Sunday had a special name: "Gaudete" Sunday. The traditions surrounding this Sunday go back as far as the fourth or fifth century, as does the season of Advent itself. Advent, our preparation for Christmas, was originally a forty-day penitential season like Lent. In fact, since it used to begin on November 12 (just after the Memorial of St. Martin of Tours), it was called "St. Martin's Lent." "Gaudete Sunday" was the Advent counterpart to "Laetare Sunday," which marks the midpoint in Lent. On Gaudete Sunday, the season of Advent shifts its focus. For the first two weeks of Advent, the focus can be summed up in the phrase, "The Lord is coming." But beginning with Gaudete Sunday, the summary might be, "The Lord is near." This shift is marked by a lighter mood and a heightened sense of joyous anticipation. Liturgically, the colors lighten as well. The priest usually wears rose-colored vestments, a hue seen only on Gaudete Sunday and Laetare Sunday. On this day, we light the third candle of the Advent wreath, which is also rose-colored, or if you prefer, pink. The word "Gaudete" is Latin for "Rejoice." In times when the focus of our anticipation is often on the negative and fearful, this celebration is a reminder that God who loves us is still in charge and that we await his coming not with fear, but with tremendous joy.


