What is the difference between the ONE FAITH CAMPAIGN and CALL TO SHARE?

Note: If you received a pledge reminder card in December for the *One Faith, One Family, One Future in Christ Campaign*, it may reference *Call to Share* and ask you to make your pledge payment to *Call to Share*. The archdiocese is aware of the error and immediately sent replacement pledge reminders. We cannot thank you enough for your patience, and most of all, your willingness to make a sacrificial gift for the immediate and future needs of our Archdiocese.

Below are some key points to distinguish these two meaningful initiatives.:

Archbishop's Call to Share

- Occurs annually at the first of the year
- Funds are used to cover items approved in the archdiocesan annual operating budget, but not covered by other sources of funds.
- Donations processed through the Archdiocese
- Monthly reminders sent from the Archdiocese
- Tax statements provided by the Archdiocese
- Supports more than 40 ministries throughout northeastern Kansas

- Occurs in a phased approach over three years
- The last diocesan capital campaign, Future Full of Hope, was 20 years ago
- 3-5-year pledge period
- Donations processed through the Archdiocese
- Monthly reminders sent from the Archdiocese

- Provides significant resources to the 4 campaign pillars: strengthening parishes, schools and evangelization, caring for retired priests, caring for our elderly at Villa St. Francis, and updating Savior Pastoral Center

Our 8th-grade students are focusing on United States history and the challenges the United States faced in the early republic. Currently, they are studying the events and effects of the War of 1812.



End Of Year

Ways to Give To Nativity and Special Tax Opportunities In 2020

As yearend approaches, we would like to remind you of various ways you can contribute to the parish, which may also benefit you for tax purposes. According to IRS guidelines **contributions must be received no later than December 31, 2020** to be included on your 2020 tax statement from the church.

Appreciated Stock

A transfer of appreciated stock whether publicly traded, mutual fund, ETF or privately-held, all which need to have been owned for longer than one year, is an efficient way to contribute. You may receive a tax deduction based on the value of the stock on the date transfer and avoid paying tax on the appreciation from your cost basis. Please contact the business office for stock transfer instructions for Nativity's brokerage account.

Qualified Charitable Contribution from your IRA

After age 70 $\frac{1}{2}$ annual withdrawals from your IRA are required. You can avoid income tax on the portion of your required minimum distribution donated to Nativity. The distribution must come directly from your IRA to Nativity. Consult your financial advisor or broker to set up a distribution.

Online Giving

Nativity offers online giving by credit card or ACH on a one-time or scheduled basis. Please visit the Online Giving option on our website, www.kcnativity.org located under Stewardship at the bottom of the home page.

New Charitable Contribution Limits

For those individuals who itemize deductions, the CARES Act removes the 60% of AGI limitation for most gifts to public charities, such as Nativity. This means you can offset up to 100% of your 2020 income with cash contributions. Contributions more than this amount can be carried forward for five years subject to the 60% AGI limit. For corporate donations, the limit is increased to 25% of taxable income from 10% previously. For those who do not itemize deductions, for 2020 you may take a new "above the line" deduction of \$300 for cash contributions.





Blessing of a Christmas Tree

Christmas is almost here! Have you blessed your Christmas tree yet?

According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity xof Epiphany. The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

In the home the Christmas tree may be blessed by a parent or another family member, in connection with the evening meal on the Vigil of Christmas or at another suitable time on Christmas Day.

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung.

The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."

The leader may greet those present in the following words:

Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever.

R/. Amen.

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light.



One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example, Titus 3:4 (lines 4-7) or Ezekiel 17:22 (lines 22-24 4; I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord.

R/. Thanks be to God.

The intercessions are then said. The leader says: Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this

sign of our faith in the Lord.

R/. Lord, give light to our hearts.


That this tree of lights may remind us of the tree of glory on

which Christ accomplished our salvation, let us pray to the

Lord. R/.







THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

That the joy of Christmas may always be in our homes, let

us pray to the Lord. R/.

That the peace of Christ may dwell in our hearts and in the

world, let us pray to the Lord. R/.

After the intercessions the leader invites all present to say the Lord's Prayer.

The leader says the prayer with hands joined: Lord our God,

we praise you for the light of creation:

the sun, the moon, and the stars of the night.

We praise you for the light of Israel:

the Law, the prophets, and the wisdom of the Scriptures.

We praise you for Jesus Christ, your Son:

he is Emmanuel, God-with-us, the Prince of Peace,

who fills us with the wonder of your love.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us

as we illumine this tree.

May the light and cheer it gives

be a sign of the joy that fills our hearts.

May all who delight in this tree

come to the knowledge and joy of salvation.

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

The lights of the tree are then illuminated.

The leader concludes the rite by signing himself or herself with the sign of the cross and saying:

May the God of glory fill our hearts with peace and joy, now

and forever.

R/. Amen.

The blessing concludes with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":

O come, thou dayspring, come and cheer

our spirits by thine advent here;

disperse the gloomy clouds of night

and death's dark shadow put to flight.

Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel

shall come to thee, O Israel.
