





In 2019, an activist state court radically changed the Kansas Constitution, making it almost impossible to regulate abortion in even the simplest of ways. Unlike our neighboring states, taxpayer-funded and late-term abortion could soon be allowed in Kansas unless we pass the Value Them Both Amendment August 2nd. 2
