

Pastor's Corner

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. As symbolized in the red vestments worn for today's Mass, this feast commemorates the martyrdom of these two great apostles who literally gave their lives in witness to the Lord. Peter was crucified on "Vatican Hill" in Rome. The tradition tells us that he requested to be hung on the cross upside down because he was not worthy to be crucified in the same manner as Christ. Paul was beheaded outside the city gates of Rome. The great Basilicas that bear their names are built over the places where they are buried.

The beautiful Preface for today's Mass proclaims this Feast so well. "By your providence the blessed Apostles Peter and Paul bring us joy: Peter, foremost in confessing the faith, Paul its outstanding preacher. Peter, who established the early Church from the remnant of Israel, Paul, master and teacher of the Gentiles that you call. Each in a different way gathered together the one family of Christ; and revered together throughout the world, they share the Martyr's crown."

The line from the old Spiritual – "There is a Balm in Gilead" gives us a good reminder for following in the footsteps of Peter and Paul. "If you cannot preach like Peter, if you cannot pray like Paul, you can tell the love of Jesus, and say He died for all." Each of us has a personal experience of Christ to share!

It's on this Feast day that new Metropolitan Archbishops receive the Pallium from the Holy Father. Archbishop Shawn McKnight will receive his Pallium today. The Pallium is part of the liturgical vestment of the archbishop. It's made from wool and it's worn around the shoulder as a symbol of the archbishop carrying the sheep on his shoulders. We pray for Archbishop McKnight in his ministry as shepherd of our Local Church and Provencial Leader of the Province of Kansas.

Happy 4th of July as we celebrate Independence Day this week! There will be one morning Mass on Friday, the 4th at 9am. If you are in town, beginning the holiday with Eucharist is always a good way to celebrate! What a blessing it is to be a citizen of the United States of America and to celebrate the freedom we enjoy in this country. Let's continue to join with Pope Leo in praying for peace and an end to war. I hope you are able to enjoy time with family and friends during the 4th of July holiday.

Welcome to Fr. Andrew Strobl, who joins us at Nativity as associate pastor. Fr. Andrew will also serve as chaplain for Bishop Miege High School. Fr. Andrew has been a priest for 16 years, has served in a variety of assignments and ministries, and brings great faith and experience. Fr. 


SUNDAY MORNINGS ST. JOSEPH ROOM



NATIVITY PRAYS



Nativity Prays is an initiative that will exercise our collective intercessory prayer in unity in a very particular way during the Jubilee year beginning on Dec 24, 2024 and concluding Jan 6, 2026.

Parishioners are invited to write out their Jubilee Year Prayers and Intentions and place them in the specially marked collection box in the back of the church near the holy water font.

The intentions slips will ultimately find their way into the Mass to Mission as Pilgrims of Hope Jubilee year travel bag. (The intentions and prayers will not be opened or read.) The collective bundle special intentions will be the focus of prayers and offerings at special events, pilgrimages, and have its resting home in the adoration chapel during the year.



Through this initiative it is expected that our collective prayer is an act of authentic communion, not only between us as individuals and God, but between all the members of our parish, uniting using one voice that rises to Heaven.

Encounter with Hope: When You See This by Deacon Jim Mullin

Encounters with Hope are not always thunderclaps. Sometimes, they come in silence—no fanfare, no spotlight—just something true breaking through the ordinary and catching your soul off guard.

It happened after the 8:15 a.m. Mass. I was sitting in the pew, lingering in thought, when a young mother stood up to leave. She had a baby in a carrier balanced on one arm and a small daughter beside her, no older than four.

They didn't rush out. Instead, they walked slowly toward the sanctuary. When they reached the center—under the Cross—the mother bowed. And the little girl... she knelt.

I couldn't look away.

They made their way to the statue of the Holy Family. The child reached up and laid a small notecard and a book at Mary's feet. A gesture so small. But something holy was happening. It wasn't rehearsed. It wasn't "for show." It was pure.

In that moment, Isaiah's words flooded my heart: "As a mother comforts her child, so I will comfort you... When you see this, your heart shall rejoice."


And I did.

Because what I witnessed was Scripture made flesh. And it cracked something open in me. A glimpse of the Church's future, not in programs or plans—but in one mother's quiet fidelity, in one little girl's kneeling heart, in love passed on without words.

That's what hope looks like.

Your encounter might be quiet too—but that doesn't mean it's small. We need your story. Share it with us.



Encounters with Hope

We invite you to participate in a special project that will help illuminate the powerful, often unspoken moments of grace and inspiration in our lives moments when we have been *moved with hope*. Talk2Me

My name is Jacob Metzner, my mom, elisemarie and I founded talk 2 me in 2019.

When I was a freshman in high school I began to struggle with my own mental health. It was a dark time for me, and I felt very alone. Thankfully, I was able to reach out and ask for help. Tragically, it became very apparent that some of my peers might not have had the right tools or didn't feel comfortable reaching out regarding their own mental health. My mom and I realized we needed to highlight mental health as a safe conversation for everyone.

Talk 2 Me keeps the lines of communication open so young people know where to turn to get help. We give mental health presentations to elementary and high school groups, mentoring groups, concerned parents, and corporations. We teach copping skills, stress reduction, and self-care. We also give instructions about what to do if you know of someone who is in a crisis. We provide grants for counseling and Mental Health Advocacy Scholarships for individuals entering college.

We know it takes courage to say when you're hurting. That is why we promote the 988 mental health crisis number so anyone can call and talk to a trained professional. Ultimately talking to just one other person can save your life. We humbly ask for your help in reaching more young people in our schools and communities. Please see us in the back of the church to learn more about our program, fundraising events, and other ways to help the youth in our community. Thank you.

Talk 2 Me will be in the back of the church this weekend with prayer cards, sweets, a diamond raffle, Chiefs tickets, and opportunities to join our upcoming events. 


