

Deacon's Corner

You Were Made to Be Received Into Glory by Deacon Jim Mullin

This weekend's readings bring us back to something so simple, but so powerful: Jesus telling us to ask, seek, and knock. Abraham dares to ask big things of God, and Jesus reminds us to be bold in asking our Father for what we need (Genesis 18, Luke 11). God is a Father who loves to give—not reluctantly, but generously. It made me stop and think: are we asking big enough? Are we asking for just a little help here and there, or are we asking for the real thing—for the life we were made for? C.S. Lewis said it so well: we don't just want to see goodness or beauty—we want to be taken into it, to become part of it: "We do not want merely to see beauty... We want to be united with the beauty we see, to pass into it, to become part of it."

As a grandparent, this hits me in a personal way—like I know it does for many of you. We don't just want our grandkids to grow up being good people. We want them to know they are **wanted by God,** that they are **precious in His sight**, that their whole life is held in **His mighty, tender hands.** And the best way we can help them see that is by showing it—by making sure they **know how precious they are to us**, how loved they are in our family, in our hearts.

One of my favorite things to share in our marriage prep classes (we just had our next-to-last session this past Tuesday!) is something I learned from Fr. Raniero Cantalamessa, preacher to the papal household. He said: "Children do not want to be loved by their mother or father separately; they want to be scooped up into the raging, wonderful love that their parents have for each other." That line just causes you to lean in to it, doesn't it? Our kids and grandkids don't just need to be loved by us—they need to be drawn into the love we live, into the joy and faith we carry, into something bigger than themselves. That's how they begin to understand the even greater love of God for them.

This Sunday is **World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly,** which Pope Francis started a few years ago. Just recently, **Pope Leo XIV** said something that really stayed with me: "The wisdom of grandparents is the quiet root beneath the branches of faith. The Church grows tall in the world because of the hidden faithfulness of those who have gone before." That's it. **Our lives, our faith, our prayers—they are roots.** The fruit may come after us, but it's the quiet, **hidden roots of love and prayer that hold everything steady.**

Many of you know this firsthand, especially those who've been through **Dan Spencer's Legacy of Faith** sessions here at Nativity or in nearby parishes. Dan challenges us to be **intentional grandparents**—because it doesn't happen by accident. **Grandparents must engage intentionally if we want to pass on a legacy of faith.** It's not enough just to love our grandkids—we need to **intentionally invite them into our love,** and even more importantly, into the **life of faith**. We aren't just passing on memories or stuff, we are called to pass on a **spiritual inheritance**. The next generation needs to know **who they are**, and even more importantly, **Whose they are**.

And here's a truth I think we don't talk about enough: You weren't just made to love God. You were made to be delighted in by God. It's one thing to say, "I love You, Lord,"—but it's a whole other thing to hear God say, "You are My beloved... in you I am well pleased." C.S. Lewis said it perfectly: "To please God... to be a real ingredient in the divine happiness... to be loved by God, not merely pitied, but delighted in... as an artist delights in his work or a father in a son... it seems impossible, but so it is." That's what I want my kids and grandkids to know. And honestly, it's what I need to remind myself of too.

This week, let's ask big:

- God, remind my family who they are.
- Lord, give me the courage to tell them how loved they are.
- Holy Spirit, help me leave behind a legacy of faith, not just stuff.

You were made to be received.

You were made to be delighted in.

You were made for glory—don't settle for less.

And let's make sure the next generation doesn't settle for less either.

P.S. — Monday night (July 28th), we'll be showing the final episode of The Chosen Season 5 in the parish hall. This episode takes us into the Garden of Gethsemane, into the depth of Jesus' love and sacrifice. Popcorn feeds the body... but only His love feeds the soul. Come ask, seek, and knock. Come, sit with Him.

Ministry Schedule Change

Dear Adoration and Liturgical Ministers,

In order to simplify the Adoration and Liturgical Ministry scheduling, we are dividing them up into two separate programs.

Adoration volunteers will now be scheduled through a new program called Volunteer Scheduler Pro, or VSP. Over the next few weeks we will be working to set up this new program and make it operational. You will be notified when the program is ready to be initiated. At that time, follow the instructions sent to you via email to create a VSP account.

If your only Ministry is Adoration, you will now only need a VSP account. The activation email will include directions for VSP account set up and MSP account removal.

For Volunteers that Adore and are Liturgical Ministers, (Altar Server, Lector, Sunday Rosary Leader, EMHC, Usher, Greeter and Sacristan), you will keep your MSP account for the above Ministries and add a VSP account for your Adoration duties. The Adoration schedule will no longer be listed on the MSP program when the new Liturgical Ministry schedule is out on August 1, 2025.

VSP is very similar to MSP. You will be able to check your assignments, request a sub and send and receive emails, specific to Adoration business.

Susan will continue to coordinate Adoration and Kathy, the Liturgical Ministers. If you have any questions, please feel free to email us through the MSP program. We are excited to be able to add this program!


Encounters with Hope

Virtus

The Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas is committed to creating safe environments. In addition to attending at a Virtus Protecting God's Children for Adults Awareness session, all employees and all volunteers working around youth or vulnerable adults must submit to a background check and read and sign our (3) Archdiocesan policies regarding abuse prevention, ethics and harassment.

To maintain safe environments in our schools and parishes, the Archdiocese has ongoing requirements for our clergy, employees and volunteers to remain in compliance. All Catholic School employees are required to complete background screenings and acknowledge policy every 3 years and likewise every 5 years for all clergy, volunteers and parish staff. The Office for Protection & Care oversees all the prevention efforts throughout the archdiocese. As many of you know, the Archdiocese partners with Virtus to implement many of the requirements. If you are a current employee or volunteer around youth or vulnerable you will be notified through the Virtus platform automatically via email 30 days in advance of when your background check comes up for renewal. Please make sure you log into your existing Virtus account to complete the process within 30 days of notification. If you receive the notice and are no longer volunteering, please contact Karen McDonald, Nativity Parish Safe Environment Coordinator, 913-491-5017 karen@kcnativity.org.

We are a community committed to preventing abuse. Our policies and programs prioritize safety of children and the vulnerable. We can all make an important difference by being a part of the safety net for our youth and vulnerable population. Thank you for doing your part.


