

#### Pastor's Corner

The gas leak that was discovered in the Church last Saturday afternoon made us take action and close the Church until the leak was fixed. Thanks for your understanding as you came for 5pm Mass and had to go elsewhere or come back the next day. Thanks for the wonderful attention of the Leawood Fire Department and the Gas Company. Their concern and caution for our safety was awesome. Thanks to Randy Monson, who heads our Facilities Committee (and knows every inch our campus) for helping me navigate the situation and come up with a solution for Sunday. Thanks to Nancy West and family, Dan & Catie Klocke Family, and Kelly Hendrickson, for all their work in transforming the gym into a worship space, and all our social media helpers who assisted us in communicating to our people. We are so grateful!

I loved the Flock Note from Deacon Jim on Sunday morning that said: "Even with a gas leak, the gym becomes a sanctuary. The altar travels – just like it did in the early Church. Where two or three gather, He is there." It was good to hear so many comments. The little one that said, "I'm glad to be back at school!" One man sitting in the bleachers said, "this is like climbing the mountain to hear Jesus." A couple who have been here from the beginning said: "It reminds me of the days we had Mass in Leawood Middle School." One lady showed me her Magnificat

that she prays from and pointed to the Entrance Antiphon: "God is in his holy place, God unites those who dwell in his house; he himself gives might and strength to his people." She smiled and said: "Here in the gym, God was with us!"

The month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. It was back in 1942, when the world was in chaos amid World War II, that Pope Pius XII consecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. As the war continued, he established the Feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary on August 22nd (the octave of the Assumption). With the revision of the liturgical calendar at Vatican II, the feast of the Immaculate Heart of Mary was switched to the Saturday following the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, and August 22nd became the Feast of the Queenship of Mary, to link it more closely with the Assumption of Mary into Heaven. All the popes since Pius XII have consecrated and reconsecrated the world to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in response to the Blessed Mother's request at Fatima. At the heart of the consecration is prayer, peace in the world, conversion of sinners, repentance for sins, religious freedom, and the call to purity and virtue. Those intentions are so applicable and timely for our day as well.


Back on May 13th, the Feast of our Lady of Fatima, the Bishop of Fatima consecrated the pontificate of Pope Leo XIV to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In Pope Leo's few months of leading the Church, we have witnessed his love for the Blessed Mother and asking for the help of her prayers. Many in this parish have consecrated themselves to the Blessed Mother, dedicating their lives to her example of loving and following Jesus, and placing their trust in her motherly accompaniment and intercession. The Feast of Mary's Assumption in the coming weeks is always a reminder that the life of discipleship leads to the Joy of Heaven!

Mary was a Pilgrim of Hope, and this Jubilee Year reminds us that being a Pilgrim of Hope is at the heart of our identity as disciples. Let's hear the invitation to the Jubilee anew: "Jesus is our hope. He is the path to be followed. He is the destination of our pilgrimage. Let us walk together toward Christ in love." It's the call of a lifetime. The Blessed Mother accompanies us on the journey... "After this our exile (our pilgrimage) show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb. Jesus. Pray

for us, O Holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ."

August is here. Enjoy the days with your kids and grandkids before they go back to school.



## NATIVITY PRAYS



Nativity Prays is an initiative that will exercise our collective intercessory prayer in unity in a very particular way during the Jubilee year beginning on Dec 24, 2024 and concluding Jan 6, 2026.

Parishioners are invited to write out their Jubilee Year Prayers and Intentions and place them in the specially marked collection box in the back of the church near the holy water font.

The intentions slips will ultimately find their way into the Mass to Mission as Pilgrims of Hope Jubilee year travel bag. (The intentions and prayers will not be opened or read.) The collective bundle special intentions will be the focus of prayers and offerings at special events, pilgrimages, and have its resting home in the adoration chapel during the year.

Through this initiative it is expected that our collective prayer is an act of authentic communion, not only between us as individuals and God, but between all the members of our parish, uniting using one voice that rises to Heaven.



# Encounter with Hope by Mary Pat Sullivan

We have been told we are to be Pilgrims of Hope in this Mission territory this year. Whaat?? That's MY job some might say?? That sounds daunting on the surface.

I am a product of the "silent generation". This is a very different message from what I received as a youth, back then, emphasis was on following the Church laws. Show up at Mass every Sunday, in our "Sunday best" (still a good idea), paying respect, considering who we are coming to see,— after all we were entering the house where God, the same God who will be at the "pearly gates," waits for us. Reading of the bible was discouraged... we "might misinterpret something"- I recall being told by one of the nuns.

Now, having been involved in CHRP years ago and more recently the Encounter Ministries Program, and with the bible study that was a part of both, I have learned so much! I know each of us is loved exponentially by Jesus, no matter what. I finally learned we can't earn what we were gifted at our baptism. I know Jesus has had my back in tough and good times. I know I can get through events I didn't choose or want. Jesus is a friend, ready to listen, comfort and heal hidden wounds. He has done this for me. He has helped me give encouragement when it was what folks needed to hear at that moment. I am full of joy and hope and happy to share his love. I hope to be like Mary sitting at His feet, the more I listen and learn, the more joy and hope there is to share! That is what we are all called to do.




## Encounters with Hope

### Virtus

The Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas is committed to creating safe environments. In addition to attending at a Virtus Protecting God's Children for Adults Awareness session, all employees and all volunteers working around youth or vulnerable adults must submit to a background check and read and sign our (3) Archdiocesan policies regarding abuse prevention, ethics and harassment.

To maintain safe environments in our schools and parishes, the Archdiocese has ongoing requirements for our clergy, employees and volunteers to remain in compliance. All Catholic School employees are required to complete background screenings and acknowledge policy every 3 years and likewise every 5 years for all clergy, volunteers and parish staff. The Office for Protection & Care oversees all the prevention efforts throughout the archdiocese. As many of you know, the Archdiocese partners with Virtus to implement many of the requirements. If you are a current employee or volunteer around youth or vulnerable you will be notified through the Virtus platform automatically via email 30 days in advance of when your background check comes up for renewal. Please make sure you log into your existing Virtus account to complete the process within 30 days of notification. If you receive the notice and are no longer volunteering, please contact Karen McDonald, Nativity Parish Safe Environment Coordinator, 913-491-5017 karen@kcnativity.org.


