Pastor's Corner

Reclaiming Sunday

Wasting time is not a prized commodity in our society. We are people ruled by the clock and learn that we always need to be plugged in. Time is money because time is filled with purposeful controlled activity which is productive of things which can be sold or put on social media.

We cannot speak of Ordinary Time without speaking of Sunday. The 7-day week and celebration of the Lord's Day is the basic structure of how our Church year is built. As we enter back into Ordinary Time, let us remember there is nothing Ordinary about it. The celebration of Sunday as the first day of the week, allows us to begin in recognition that on the first day of the week the Lord of life was raised up and creation came at last to completion. Sunday as a day of play and worship is a sacrament of reclaimed and redeemed time. How we live Sunday proclaims to the world what we believe about redeemed time now and forever.

Sunday reminds us that, in Genesis, the Lord rested on the seventh day from the work of creation, not because he was tired, but to contemplate and enjoy what He brought into being. This weekly rest from work and regular activity reminds us of our fundamental identity as children of God, our need to worship Him, the necessity of relationship with the Lord, our family, friends and even ourselves.

If we see every Sunday as a 'little Easter' in remembrance of the day the Lord rose from the dead, an event that draws us beyond time and space into the eternal and timeless love of the Father, our earthly liturgy every Sunday is a participation in the heavenly one. In the Eucharist, we step out of the chronological unfolding of historical time and enter into God's activity of love and contemplation.

So how can we reclaim Sunday as a day of worship, play and rest and relationship? Make Sunday Mass an absolute priority - no exceptions or excuses. Plan your weekend accordingly with Eucharist at the center. Plan an outing, a game, a nap, reading a good book, spending quality time with family and friends. Reclaim the great tradition of Sunday as a festive occasion. Let Sunday be a day out of the ordinary routine that renews and reorients us to the great mystery of God.

In many ways, the life of heaven will be like our experience of the Sunday Eucharist – gathered in the presence of the Lord of all creation as His people, praising and loving Him and the gift of life. If we do not want to spend time with the Lord now, here on earth by participating in the banquet feast of the Eucharist, how will we want to do it for all eternity? Sunday Mass forms our hearts and lives for the glorious experience of eternity. Let's reclaim Sunday for Jesus and for us!

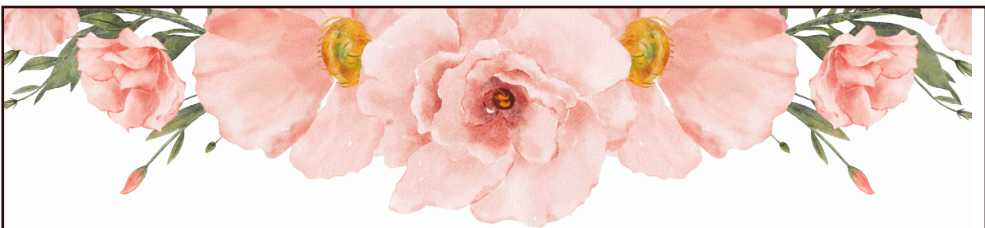

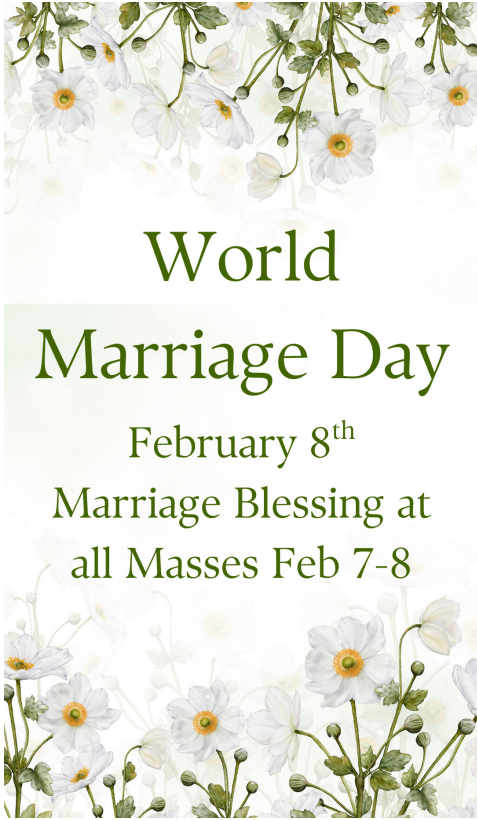
