Pastor's Corner

Capital Campaign Update

As we continue planning for the future of our parish and school, I want to take this opportunity to update you on the status of our capital campaign and the steps that have been taken since the planning study.

Once we received Archdiocesan approval to move forward with our capital campaign, we entered into a 12-week Preparation Phase in partnership with the Steier Group. This phase is an important part of a successful campaign because it allows us to put the right structure, leadership, materials, and communication plan in place before asking parishioners to make their commitment. It also gives us time for prayerful planning and clear communication, so every parishioner understands the need and the vision, and how they can be part of Nativity's future. Our work to date includes:

Building Project Update

Feedback from the planning study showed that expansion of our educational and faith formation spaces are the parish's highest priorities. The study also indicated that our parish community has the capacity to raise between \$13 million to \$16 million during a three-year campaign.

Based on these findings, parish and school leadership, together with the Building Committee, have been working during the past several weeks to refine the scope of this expansion. This work is intended to align the project with anticipated funding, address Nativity's most pressing needs, and ensure responsible stewardship of parish resources.

Campaign Leadership

I want to thank Steve and Shannon Clifford, Jack and Emily Erkmann, and Michael and Courtney Raupp for answering the call and saying "yes" to serving as our Campaign General Chairs.

In the coming weeks, you will hear more about various volunteer opportunities and how you can be part of this important parish-wide effort. If you have already expressed an interest in volunteering, thank you! We will be reaching out directly over the next several weeks as we complete the build-out of the extended leadership team.

Campaign Theme

Forty years ago, our parish was founded on faith, sacrifice, and a deep love for Christ and His Church. Today, we stand on the shoulders of those original families as we celebrate our 40th anniversary at the Church of the Nativity.

God is calling us to look to the future. Our parish is growing in new ways as we adapt to the changing needs of today, and we are ready to expand our educational and faith formation facilities to form the next generation of disciples. Our theme for this historic campaign is **"Building on the Heart of Nativity."**

Communications

Beginning next week, we will launch a **Frequently Asked Questions** series to address the most common questions we have heard about the campaign timeline, our space needs, the refined building plan, financial stewardship, and long-term campus planning. This series is intended to help every parish and school family better understand the needs before us, the steps being taken in response to the planning study, and the shared opportunity we have to build on the heart of Nativity for our children, our parish and our future.

Please continue to pray for the success of our efforts and growing love for the Heart of Christ in home here at Nativity.

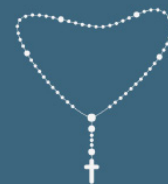

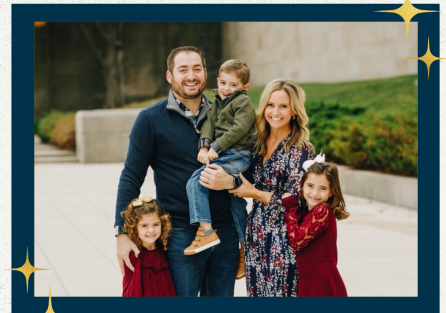


40 Years of Nativity

In December 1986, Fr. Tank and the Pastoral Council invited us to form a women's club. This was an opportunity to bring together women from 2 different parishes to help form the Nativity family. The goals for the Women's Club were to provide opportunities for spiritual growth, foster charitable involvement, offer social activities, and to assist the pastor as needed. In February, notice was put in the parish bulletin inviting all women of the parish to attend one of 4 coffees held at the parish house to learn about the proposed group, to voice their ideas on needed committees, and to sign up for committees they were interested in. In March, a letter was sent to all parish women describing the newly formed Women's Club. Dates for sign up after Masses at LMS and Information on upcoming events were included. Our first event was a day of recollection held at Avila College. Monthly charitable collections were held after Sunday Masses to aid various non-profit organizations. Mothers of Young Children organized an Easter Egg Hunt. Social activities included Dinner for 8, lunch bunch, bridge group, holiday luncheons and fashion shows, and Mother's Day carnation sale for Birthrite. The sale of boxed apples advertised as Christmas gifts for family, friends, and business contacts was profitable. All profits raised from social activities were designated for the Baptismal Font in the new church. We were very blessed with many women willing to share their time and talents to create the Women's Club. While the Women's Club has evolved over the years, the friendships formed during those early years still continue 40 years later.

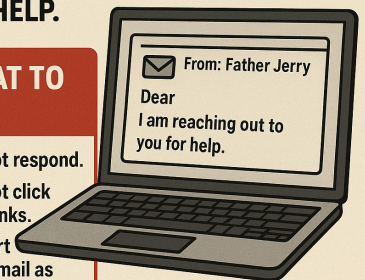
