Pastor's Corner

A Yellow School Sign for All of Us

As summer draws to a close and a new school year begins, we are once again reminded to pay special attention to those familiar yellow road signs showing a boy and girl carrying books. Those signs mean, **"Slow down—school zone."**

But perhaps those yellow school signs can be signs of life for all of us. They can remind us not only to reduce the speed of our cars, but also that learning is not just the business of children between the ages of six and eighteen. To be a student is a lifetime vocation for each of us.

We attend school for several years not simply to acquire knowledge, but hopefully to learn how to love learning. The yellow school signs might therefore cause us to ask ourselves: Am I still a student? Am I still a person who enjoys learning new things? Am I still growing?

Students are recognized on those signs by the book they carry. There are many ways to learn, especially in our 21st-century world. Education has changed dramatically over the last several decades, and this is one of the reasons we need to expand our parish school. Our school is excelling in new and creative approaches to quality learning while remaining firmly rooted in the Catholic faith.

As we begin another school year, we should also remind our parents that they are still, and always will be, the primary educators of their children—especially in the areas of faith and spirituality. Our Catholic schools and religious education programs can do much, but they cannot replace what happens in the home.

When parents pray for and with their children, attend Sunday Mass together, go to confession, and make the practice of faith a normal part of family life, they teach lessons that no classroom can fully provide. When these practices are absent, it greatly hinders the religious formation of our children.

This year, we are especially grateful to be offering confessions every Wednesday evening, giving our families another opportunity to encounter the mercy of God. The sacramental life of the Church is not simply something we teach our children about; it is something we live together as families.

There is another important lesson contained in those yellow school signs—one that we especially need to hear in the world today: **"SLOW DOWN!"**

All true learning requires leisure and rest. In fact, our English word school ultimately comes from the Greek word *scholē*, meaning leisure. There is wisdom in that. We cannot learn, grow, pray, reflect, or deepen our relationships when our lives are constantly filled with noise, activity, and pressure.

Perhaps our lack of leisure is one of the reasons so many people feel tired, anxious, divided, and even "old." We remain youthful not simply through creams, diets, or physical exercise, but by remaining curious, open-hearted, and willing to learn. There is a certain joy that comes from discovering something new, seeing the world with fresh eyes, and allowing God to continue forming us. And perhaps that is where homework comes in.

Homework may not be quite as popular today as it was when I was a child, but some homework is always good for the soul. Our homework as Christians might include reading Scripture, praying with the people who share our homes, spending time in silence, attending Mass, going to confession, serving others, and becoming involved in the charitable life of our parish and community. That kind of homework opens new frontiers for our hearts, minds, and souls.

So, the next time you see one of those familiar yellow school signs, slow down for the students. But let the sign speak to you as well. Perhaps it is an invitation to slow down in your own life—to make room for prayer, for leisure, for learning, for the people you love, and most especially for God.

For we are all still students in the school of life, and ultimately, we are all students in the school of Christ. May this new school year be a time when our children grow in knowledge, our families grow in faith, and all of us rediscover the joy of learning, the gift of leisure, and the peace that comes when we slow down enough to listen to God.

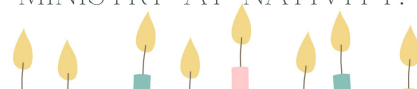

Why Nativity Needs More Space

Our goal is to communicate clearly and transparently so every parish and school family better understands the needs before us, the steps being taken in response to the planning study, and the shared opportunity we have to build on the heart of Nativity for our children, our parish, and our future.

May the Holy Spirit guide us in our efforts and inspire us to work together with faith, hope and love as a parish family so that what we build today will serve our faith community for decades to come.

Why is an expansion needed if the current school building once served 700 students in grades K-8?

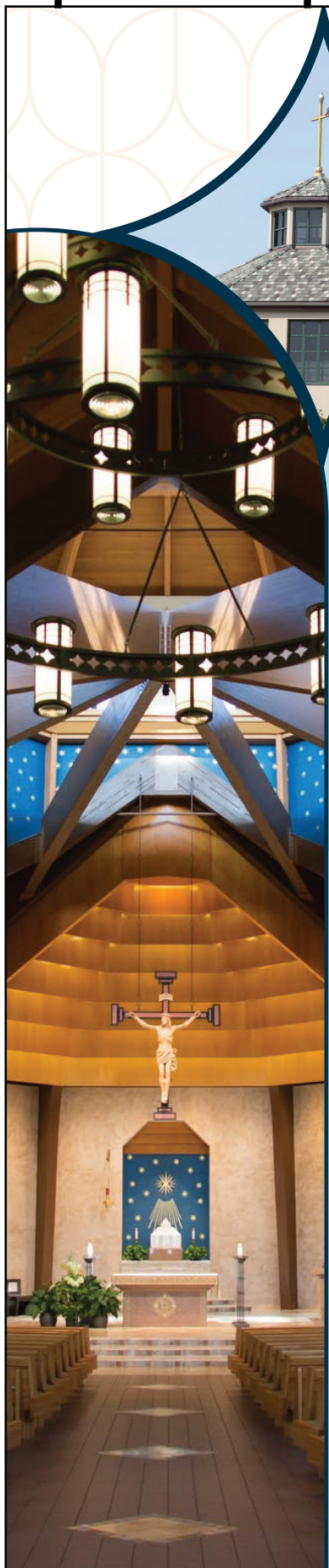
Our school was built for a different era of education. Today's students learn through collaboration, creativity, hands-on exploration, and differentiated instruction. To support this more dynamic educational model, *spaces that once served as traditional classrooms have been thoughtfully reallocated for:*

- Day School early learning classrooms.
- STREAM, an educational approach to incorporating Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, the Arts, and Mathematics.
- Student Support Services, including counseling, intervention, and enrichment programs, designed to meet the diverse academic, social, emotional, and developmental needs of every student.
- Expanded electives and small group instruction.

While these programs are essential to providing a high-quality 21st-century Catholic education, they have reduced the number of traditional classrooms available for grades K-8, creating a real and growing need for additional space.

At the parish level, Nativity is also experiencing growing participation in faith formation, sacramental preparation, evangelization, and life-long discipleship. The Christian Formation team currently operates within the existing school footprint, demonstrating the need for dedicated ministry space that supports formation while also relieving pressure on academic areas.

TOGETHER, these school and parish needs reveal a shared reality:
Nativity's mission is expanding, and our facilities must be prepared to support that mission for generations to come.



Capital Campaign

How many classrooms does the school currently have and how are they allocated?

As Figure 1 illustrates, our school building includes 31 classrooms. Beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, our parish school will serve three sections of kindergarten through fifth grade. As enrollment continues to grow and a third section is added to grades 6–8 over the coming years, the existing facility will no longer have sufficient classroom space to support three sections at every grade level. This capacity will be exceeded by the 2029–2030 school year.

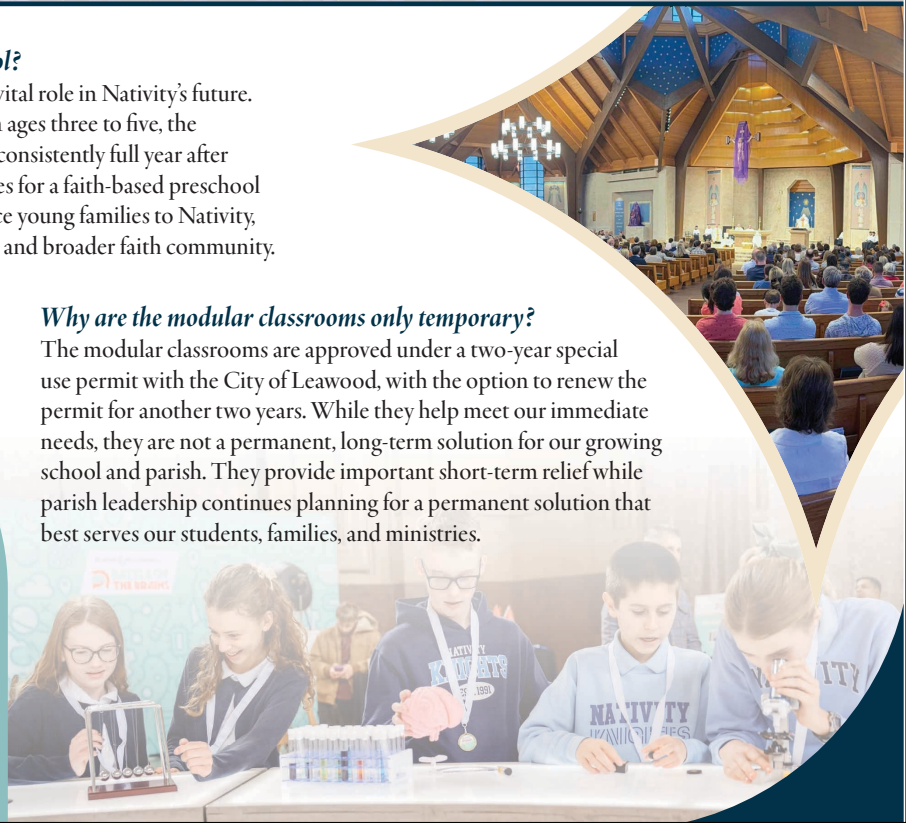

Why is there a need for a dedicated Day School?

Our Day School early education program plays a vital role in Nativity's future. Since becoming licensed in 2019 to serve children ages three to five, the program has continued to thrive. Classrooms are consistently full year after year, demonstrating strong demand among families for a faith-based preschool environment. The Day School also helps introduce young families to Nativity, creating a natural pathway into our parish, school, and broader faith community.

Why are the modular classrooms only temporary?

The modular classrooms are approved under a two-year special use permit with the City of Leawood, with the option to renew the permit for another two years. While they help meet our immediate needs, they are not a permanent, long-term solution for our growing school and parish. They provide important short-term relief while parish leadership continues planning for a permanent solution that best serves our students, families, and ministries.

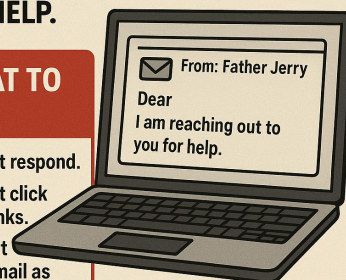
