Pastor's Corner

From Retaliation to Restoration

When someone wrongs us, our human instinct is retaliation. We want to strike back or at least to hold a quiet resentment. In the Gospel this weekend, Jesus offers a different blueprint for conflict, calling us to a journey of private honesty and restoration. This is not a legal checklist; it is a manifestation of divine mercy aimed at winning back the one who has wronged us.

Think about a common modern dilemma: a frustrating group text or email. The temptation to hit "Reply All" and publicly reprimand the sender is intense. But doing so explodes the conflict. Jesus' command to "go and tell him his fault between you and him alone" is the spiritual equivalent of taking the issue offline. By keeping it private first, we protect the person's dignity and swap public retaliation for holy reconciliation. I would also add it is best to go to the person privately by talking to them, rather than via email or text.

In his commentary series "Food for the Soul", Dr. Peter Kreeft notes that this process mimics a medical intervention: "the law is like an X-ray, sin is like cancer, and salvation is like an operation." When we approach someone in truth and charity, we are not acting as a self-righteous judge trying to execute a sentence. Instead, we are acting alongside Christ as a spiritual surgeon. The ultimate goal is never to destroy the patient or banish them from our life; it is to cut away the destructive cancer of sin to preserve the soul, protect the community, and heal the relationship.

However, we cannot offer this surgery to others if we are still bleeding from our own unconfessed wounds. We must first allow Christ to heal us in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. In the confessional, we step onto the operating table, expose our sins, and allow Jesus to bind our wounds. To make this healing more accessible, we have added a new Wednesday evening confession time at 6:00. If you are not sure how to go the person first, maybe go to God in confession first and believe the grace given will be some insight and strength.

Jesus promises, "where two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Let us choose reconciliation over retaliation, trusting He is with us.

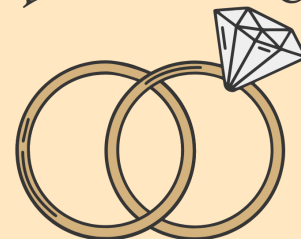

Has Nativity completed a facility master planning process?

In 2023, a steering committee was formed under the leadership of Fr. Mike Hawken to begin the master planning process. Members of the parish councils, organizations and leadership, along with school faculty and administration, met to discuss the needs of our evolving educational programming and growing parish ministries. Facility updates and expansions were identified and shared in our recent campaign planning study. Parishioner feedback from the study revealed our first priority: an educational and faith formation expansion.

How does the educational and faith formation expansion fit into Nativity's long-term facility master plan?

The two-story educational and faith formation expansion addresses our most immediate and highest priority: permanent educational and faith formation space. At the same time, parish and school leadership has considered building placement, site use, playground space, parking, and future school and parish needs to ensure the project fits responsibly within the broader campus.

What existing spaces will be renovated or repurposed once the educational and faith formation expansion is complete?

One important benefit of the educational and faith formation expansion is that by adding new classroom and faith formation space, we will have the opportunity to renovate or repurpose existing classrooms in the original school building for STREAM education, student support services, non-traditional learners, and small-group instruction. These renovations will be completed as funding allows.

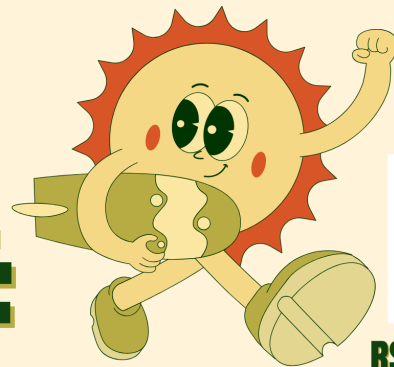
