LITURGY, SPIRITUALITY & PARISH NEWS

In the old spiritual, "Keep Your Lamps Trimmed and Burning" we hear the imperative to wait and be ready, and while there are many variations, it usually ends "The world is nearly done." "The time is drawing near." or "The day is dawning nigh." The liturgical year is near its end, and we begin to feel that tension of "already but not yet" as the readings become more eschatological (about the end-times) in nature. We are called to wait patiently. Yet, like the wise and foolish virgins, we run the risk of falling asleep, and or running out of oil. Waiting for God, preparing for God, requires much hope, much preparation and discipline, and at times it is counter-intuitive. We must put aside impatience or the desire for immediate gratification and keep the end in sight. In running terms, it is not a sprint, but a marathon.

LAMPS TRIMMED AND BURNING

So how do we do this? Whether we are sitting in the pew or one of those involved more intimately in liturgical ministry, this is a call for spiritual self-maintenance. None of our scriptures today is passive. Seeking and waiting for God requires

work. Presence and participation in the liturgy are among the easiest and most natural ways to provide fuel for our spiritual lamps. But like a car, we need to do more than just put in gasoline. There are other needs to attend to for upkeep. Just read the opportunities in this bulletin! Perhaps you may want to attend a parish scripture class or find a spiritual book to read. Sign up online to receive the daily readings or some sort of daily reflection. Find a spiritual podcast to listen to on your commute home from work or turn off the news and music and drive in morning silence. Share simple, regular prayer times as a family such as at meals and bedtime. Experience the sacrament of Reconciliation. Or maybe you do too much, and the call is to let go of something. Do not become burned out or lose heart. Take courage and remember, "The day is drawing nigh!" Amen.

Catholic Prayer: November Devotion: The Holy Souls in Purgatory

Description:

Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. As a reminder of our duty to pray for the suffering faithful in Purgatory, the Church has dedicated the month of November to the Holy Souls. The Holy Souls are those who have died in the state of grace but who are not yet free from all punishment due to their unforgiven venial sins and all other sins already forgiven for which satisfaction is still to be made. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

Prayer:

INVOCATION Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

My Jesus, by the sorrows Thou didst suffer in Thine agony in the Garden, in Thy scourging and crowning with thorns, in the way to Calvary, in Thy crucifixion and death, have mercy on the souls in purgatory, and especially on those that are most forsaken; do Thou deliver them from the dire torments they endure; call them and admit them to

Thy most sweet embrace in paradise. Our Father, Hail Mary, Eternal rest, etc.

FOR ALL THE DECEASED

By Thy resurrection from the dead, O Christ, death no longer hath dominion over those who die in holiness. So, we beseech Thee, give rest to Thy servants in Thy sanctuary and in Abraham's bosom. Grant it to those, who from Adam until now have adored Thee with purity, to our fathers and brothers, to our kinsmen and friends, to all men who have lived by faith and passed on their road to Thee, by a thousand ways, and in all conditions, and make them worthy of the heavenly kingdom. *Byzantine Liturgy*

DE PROFUNDIS

The psalmist is crying out here from the depression that grips him because of his sense of sin. He tells God that no man could be forgiven should strict justice be demanded; but, since God is forgiving and merciful, the psalmist (Israel) will hope for redemption from iniquities. We, who know the mercy of God far better than the Israelites, may pray this psalm with even greater trust in God.

The Church uses this psalm in the liturgy as her official prayer for the souls in Purgatory. Out of the depths I cry to You, O Lord; O Lord, hear my voice!

Let Your ears be attentive to my voice in supplication:

If You, O Lord, mark iniquities, Lord, who can stand?

But with You is forgiveness, that You may be revered.

I trust in the Lord; my soul trusts in His word.

My soul waits for the Lord more than sentinels wait for the dawn.

More than sentinels wait for the dawn, let Israel wait for the Lord,

For with the Lord is kindness and with Him is plenteous redemption;

And He will redeem Israel from all their iniquities.

Psalm 130

THE MISERERE

This psalm is a marvelous act of contrition, confession, and supplication by a repentant sinner. It was composed by David after his sin with Bethsabee. In reparation David promises to lead others back to God by telling them of the ways of divine justice. Instead of offering God an external sacrifice which he knows He will not accept, he offers instead the sacrifice of a contrite and humble heart, a sacrifice that will always be most pleasing in the eyes of God.

Have mercy on me, O God, in Your goodness; in the greatness of Your compassion wipe out my offense.

Thoroughly wash me from my guilt and of my sin cleanse me.

For I acknowledge my offense, and my sin is before me always:

"Against You only have I sinned, and done what is evil in Your sight"—

That You may be justified in Your sentence, vindicated when You condemn.

Indeed, in guilt was I born, and in sin my mother conceived me;

Behold, You are pleased with sincerity of heart, and in my inmost being You teach me wisdom.

Cleanse me of sin with hyssop, that I may be purified; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Let me hear the sounds of joy and gladness; the bones You have crushed shall rejoice.

Turn away Your face from my sins, and blot out all my guilt.

A clean heart create for me, O God, and a steadfast spirit renew within me.

Cast me not out from Your presence, and Your holy spirit take not from me.

Give me back the joy of Your salvation, and a willing spirit sustain in me.

I will teach transgressors Your ways, and sinners shall return to You.

Free me from blood guilt, O God, my saving God; then my tongue shall revel in Your justice.

O Lord, open my lips, and my mouth shall proclaim Your praise.

For You are not pleased with sacrifices; should I offer a holocaust, You would not accept it.

My sacrifice, O God, is a contrite spirit; a heart contrite and humbled, O God, You will not spurn.

Be bountiful, O Lord, to Sion in Your kindness by rebuilding the walls of Jerusalem; Then shall You be pleased with due sacrifices, burnt offerings and holocausts; then shall they offer up bullocks on Your altar.

Psalm 50

FOR THE SOULS IN PURGATORY

O Lord, who art ever merciful and bounteous with Thy gifts, look down upon the suffering souls in purgatory. Remember not their offenses and negligences, but be mindful of Thy loving mercy, which is from all eternity. Cleanse them of their sins and fulfill their ardent desires that they may be made worthy to behold Thee face to face in Thy glory. May they soon be united with Thee and hear those blessed words which will call them to their heavenly home: "Come, blessed of My Father, take possession of the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world."

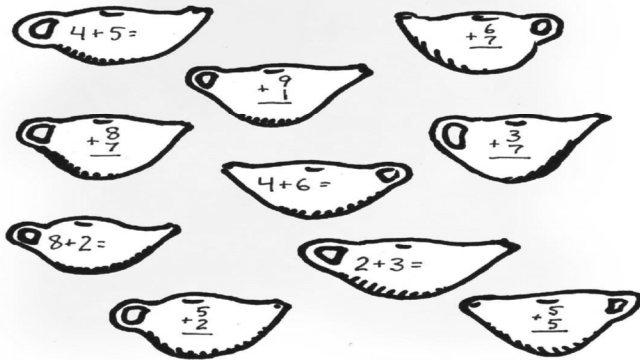

Always be Ready

Have you ever thought to yourself that it would be better to have fun and be bad now, and then be good later? That's what some of the bridesmaids in today's parable were like. They only brought enough oil for their lamps, and didn't bother to bring any extra. But the other bridesmaids had been wise and took along extra flasks to refill their lamps when it got late. When the bridegroom came, those who hadn't brought extra oil were gone, getting more oil, and missed the feast!



Sometimes people say that they have lots of time to change from their evil ways, so they don't repent right away. This parable shows us that it is very foolish to leave important things until later. Nobody knows when they will die, so we should always be ready.

The oil of the bridesmaids is like the grace in our souls. We need to make sure that our soul always has sanctifying grace, which we need to get into Heaven. We lose that grace when we do a serious sin. That is why if we ever commit a serious sin, we should go to confession as soon as we can so that we will always have grace and be ready for when we die.

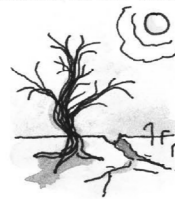

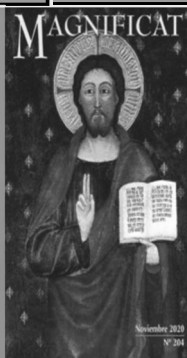

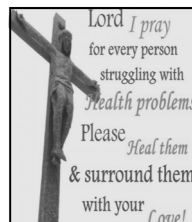

Gratitude Box

Decorate a box for your Thanksgiving table (or any day, really) and fill it with messages of gratitude to be read aloud as you gather for your holiday meal.

Needed

Shoebox (or box of similar size); colored pencils, crayons, or markers; slips of paper, about 3" x 5".
Optional: colored paper or wrapping paper; scissors; tape or glue; stickers, glitter, or natural embellishments such as pine cones or seeds

Activity Plan

1. On Thanksgiving Day or several days before, decorate a shoebox as simply or as elaborately as you like. (If your box has a lid, wrap it separately so it is easy to put on and take off.) Print "Gratitude Box" on the side of the box.
2. Place the box in a high traffic area of your home, such as on the kitchen counter or the coffee table in the family room. Put a stack of 3" x 5" slips of paper next to it, along with colored pencils, crayons, or markers. Ask each family member to take a moment before Thanksgiving dinner and write down things they are thankful for, one thing per slip of paper. (For example: school, apples, Grandma, my job, warm house, books, Jesus.) Pair older children or adults with young children to write down the things they dictate. Children may want to illustrate their slips.
3. Have family members place their completed slips of paper in the Gratitude Box.
4. When you sit down for your Thanksgiving meal, bring the box to the table. Have family members take turns pulling out a blessing slip and reading it aloud. Continue until all the slips have been read. Point out that each of these blessings is a gift from God.
5. While counting these blessings, you will no doubt be reminded of many more, making the list even longer as you praise and thank God for the biggest gifts (each other) and the smallest (such as a favorite toy).
6. After this "reading of the blessings," pray aloud:

O God, we praise you, we bless you, we thank you for this day and the opportunity to be gathered together. Thank you for each blessing in our Gratitude Box and for your overflowing generosity. Please bless our loved ones who are not with us today and care for everyone who is sick or feeling lonely. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
