Remembering Those

Who Have Gone Before Us

This weekend we celebrate Halloween and prepare to greet the children going door to door seeking a handout of candy. In a special way, we will bless their costumes and pray for their safety as they enjoy their evening of fun. Then on Nov. 1, we celebrate All Saints Day.

During the month of November, we are called in a special way "to remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest." We invite parishioners to write the names of their relatives and friends in our Book of the Dead to be remembered at all masses during the month.

On Nov. 2, we celebrate All Souls Day. Originating in the Fourth Century as the Eastern Feast of All Martyrs, and attested to by St. Ephrem, Pope Gregory IV established this commemoration for all the Roman Church in 835 A.D.

Originally celebrated on Easter Friday, it came to be held in Rome on May 13; later, in the Ninth Century, it was transferred to Nov. 1, the date of its celebration in Ireland where it countered the Celtic pagan feast of the Druids.

All are invited to a special mass on Nov. 2 to remember the deceased members of our parish family, and those lost in the past year, including due to the pandemic, to help bring closure for those families who could not properly celebrate the loss of their loved one. Mass will begin at 7:00 pm in the church and will include the annual display of people we have lost to death, a sung litany and presentation of a remembrance candle to those families present. The Book of the Dead will be revered and blessed as it lists those who have gone before us. Finally, we invite you to use the All Souls envelopes in the pews to list all those whom you would like included in the All Souls Novena this year.

Spiritual Reflection: *May the souls of the faithful departed through the mercy of God, Rest in peace.*

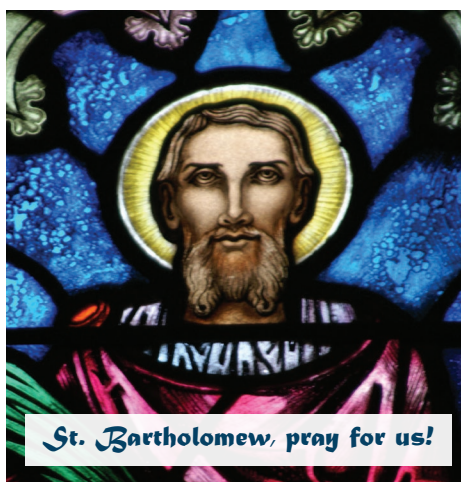

Archbishop Jose H. Gomez celebrated a Mass last Sunday at the Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels to recognize the initiation of the 16th Synod of Bishops and the archdiocesan phase. The theme of the synod is "For a synodal Church: communion, participation and mission." The consultative process at the diocese will begin in early 2022 to gather perspectives from local Catholics.
