First Reading: Isaiah 53:10-11

Jim Seksinsky, however, took the helm and was instrumental in the engineering of this beautiful addition to our cemetery. With the help of Jim's son Mark, they used a lift to hoist the 160 pound cross into position. Fr. Hoke wanted a Spanish style roof. Jim researched and found a company willing to work with him on such a small job. Jim spent many hours with the company working out the dimension and angles. The final touch was the solar light that illuminates the Crucifix at night. When you see Jim, please ask him about the location that was selected.




