

However, the full original name of this city is "El Pueblo de Nuestar Senora la Reina de los Angeles de Porciuncula" that is 'The town of our Lady, Queen of the Angels of the Little Church'. This is the name of the second tumbling down little church that St. Francis restored around 1216.

EIGHTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Ecclesiastes 1:2, 2:21-23

"Vanity of vanities." Sometimes we may work for wealth, wisdom and knowledge only to discover that it has been left for someone who did not toil for it. The offering of our work, fatigue and pain, if not for God, can also be a kind of vanity.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11

Paul urges us to seek what is good and from God, encouraging us to put our minds on the spiritual. He reminds us that, as Christians, we have died with Christ and are hidden with Christ until his glory is once again revealed. We are all one in Christ.

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21

On being requested to settle a question of inheritance, Jesus heeds us to beware of all covetousness because our life does not consist on the wealth of possessions. Through the lesson of a parable Jesus reinforces this teaching, explaining that those who store up the treasures of wealth and possessions are not the richest in God's eyes.

This is a coach with air conditioning and bathroom facilities.

Riders should bring a bagged lunch. We will have bottled water. We could not find a restaurant that could accommodate 60 people at one time, so we will provide snacks for the ride home.

Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will begin at 2:30 p.m., and Bishop Gainer will give a talk in St. Mary's Chapel at 2:45 p.m. The Divine Mercy Chaplet will be said at 3:30 p.m. The day will conclude with Benediction at 3:50 p.m. Gates to the Grotto will close at 4:30 p.m.

The Gift of a Plenary Indulgence is granted to members of a pilgrimage group who, out of devotion to the Blessed Mother and Our Lord, Jesus Christ, visit the National Shrine Grotto on any day of the year.

HIGHLIGHTS OF ST. JOSEPH CHURCH HISTORY

The first recorded history of St. Joseph's Church is a deed dated May 13, 1805, in which John and Margaret Keefer transferred to the Reverend Francis Neale of the Jesuit Missions at Georgetown on the Potomac in the State of Maryland, for the sum of one dollar, a plot of ground comprising about two acres in Turbot Township. This land is the site of the present parish cemetery.

The original plot of ground consisting of seventy-one acres had been purchased by the Keffer family, September 20, 1789. Just when the Keffer family permanently settled in Turbot Township is not known. But they were among the first Catholic settlers on the fertile lands in the township, and the need of a Catholic Cemetery and Church most have prompted the generosity of the family.

Prior to the transfer of the two acres, the Keffer farm was the burial site for Catholics. A tombstone still standing on this tract bears the inscription that Morris Lawrence (originally spelled Lorentz0 died June 14, 1792, aged 109 years, 6 months and 21 days.
