From Your Pastor.

This Third Sunday in Ordinary Time has the distinction of being a feast: The Sunday of the Word of God. It was established by Pope Francis in 2019 to stress the importance of the Scriptures in our Catholic Faith. It is beneficial that this Mass stressing the importance of the Bible comes during the weeklong prayers for Christian unity. One of the great blessings of Vatican II was to restore a lost treasure, that of the Bible in the life of the Church. When there is a procession at the beginning of Mass, the Gospel Book is brought in and placed on the altar.

The Liturgy of the Word has become a very important part of our Catholic worship - at every Mass and in every celebration of the sacraments. Many more Catholics spend time reading and praying the scriptures on their own or with friends. This is a great blessing. I hope that because you have your own Hymnal/ Missal in hand, in the car or at your prayer space at home that you are praying and reflecting upon the importance of the Word of God to become flesh in your own body and soul.

Our gospel passage stresses that those who had walked in darkness have seen a great light, that light coming from the northern region was the coming of Jesus to call His Church together to become His light to the nation. We are still working at it. It is a work in process, over two thousand years of processing, but we will get there by the grace of God. It is the Holy Spirit that will reunite the separated churches back into one bond of charity- of mind and heart in the Lord.

Please continue to pray for the unborn, tomorrow, 'A Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children'. We have come a long way but more light needs to shine on these little ones and welcome them into our community. Please pray and fast tomorrow - January 23rd.

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 8:23—9:3

The prophet Isaiah describes the anguish of a conquered people, but he promises that they will triumph and will see a great light as on the "day of Midian."

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17

Paul speaks to the Corinthians with both anger and indignation because they are quarreling among themselves as to whom they should show allegiance. Some wish to follow Paul; some, Peter; others Apollos; others, Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 4:12-23

Jesus begins his mission by going to Capernaum, fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah. He selects Peter, Andrew, James and John as his disciples, inviting them to be "fishers of men."

RESPECT LIFE DAY OF PRAYER



January 23, 2023 has been set aside as "a particular day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through

acts of abortion." Life is at the heart of the gospel – a beautiful gift from God.

When that gift is destroyed rather than treasured, a violent act is committed not just against God, but all humanity. As Pope John Paul II remarked, "The Gospel of God's love for man, the Gospel of the dignity of the person, and the Gospel of life are a single and indivisible Gospel."

CONFIRMATION RETREAT AT ST. JOSEPH, MILTON

Saturday, January 14, 2023





In preparation for their confirmation, 28 students from St. Pius-Selinsgrove, St. Joseph-Danville, St. Monica-Sunbury and our own candidates participated in a day filled with prayer, instruction, reflection, spiritual renewal and a time of genuine fellowship. The retreat opened with Mass offered by Father Hoke at the Parish Center. Then John Paul Kasperowicz of *Big Heart Harvest* took over.

Early in the session, John Paul set up for a very moving conclusion to the day. He asked the students to write down what would or does keep them from God. They could write or draw their thoughts, and they were not to identify themselves. He then collected them. At the close of the day, JP asked the students to think about their original reasons to avoid God and to pray about

this conflict. He dropped their writings or drawings on the floor. When they were ready, they were to pick up any one and tear it up, and then go pray before the tabernacle. While they contemplated, he then sang an original hymn. Several students were brought to tears. Bishop Gainor will confirm the students on March 4th at St. Pius.
