From Your Pastor.

It is said that the Kingdom of God is exactly the opposite of the kingdom of this fallen world, the kingdom of darkness. In the Kingdom of light and peace what was on the bottom of this world has been lifted up to be on top and what was on top of this world is pulled down to be on the bottom. It is an upside-down world where the virtues of divine life become dominate and the vices of our fallen state are cast away forever.

The Eight Beatitudes are not a pick-and-choose what grace you might like, but rather all eight are necessary to form the New Adam/Eve creature. It begins with an enduring attitude that we are poor in spirit, in need of Christ to save us and enrich us with His Life. We are always poor in spirit - in need of God's grace to forgive and mercifully save us from evil. That is why we always begin Holy Mass with the confession of our sinfulness. If we do not figure this out, we won't figure anything out.

The whole Church has come to realize that we have lost so much respect, value and sincere pius attachment to the Holy Mass and the Blessed Sacrament. Yet, we know by the teachings of the saints, the bishops and the popes that all life and grace of the Church comes from the Eucharist and returns to the Eucharist. We need to help one another to return to a humble sincere love of the Blessed Sacrament.

The Parish Council has given me the go ahead to establish one day a week a 24 hour period of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. The day will be from Monday morning to Tuesday morning. We will come together to pray for greater love of the Eucharist, for those who have left the Catholic Faith and those who come but need a boost of renewed devotion. I will be working hard each Sunday from now to Lent to help us get this great project accomplished for the glory of God and the salvation of our souls. More details are coming. Let us pray for the success of our own parish full day of adoration.

FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Zephaniah 2:3, 3:12-13

Zephaniah prophesies that the Lord will punish wicked nations along with Jerusalem, but he will shelter from his anger those who practice justice and humility and do no wrong.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 1:26-31

Paul tells the Corinthians that God prefers the humble, the weak, the lowly of station — people like themselves. In Christ Jesus they will find wisdom, honor and justice.

Gospel: Matthew 5:1-12a

Jesus teaches the Beatitudes in his Sermon on the Mount. He extols those who are merciful, peaceful, lowly, poor in spirit and promises them that "the reign of God is theirs."
