From Your Pastor.

This Third Sunday of Lent begins to open us to three incredibly special Gospel teachings from St. John. Today and for the next two Sundays we will be looking at the hidden meaning behind the Sacraments of Christian initiation. Only a community of Christians who have come into existence from the sacraments, existed on the sacraments and who live daily proclaiming the sacraments would be able to get as excited as Catholics do over the Women at the well. Others will hardly get it.

The excitement is that Jesus is thirsty for our love and this causes us to be very thirsty for Christ's love in the Blessed Sacrament. There are only two times in the Gospel that we read that Jesus was thirsty, here at the well and on the cross. A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

The Reverend John A. Mahony was ordained in 1902. He came to Milton from Hanover in 1910. His first parish improvement was the cemetery. The land adjacent to the cemetery had been the site of the first church and rectory. Father Fitzpatrick

had planted an apple orchard on the unoccupied ground. When the new church was built on Walnut Street, the old church and rectory gradually fell into disrepair and disappeared but the orchard remained until about 1908 when it was made the *new section* of the cemetery. The new section (the current "old" section closest to

Broadway Road) was laid out in 1908, but no provision was made for its upkeep. Father Mahony made the cemetery improvement his first project. He also brought to the attention of the County Commissioners the miserable condition of the township road along the cemetery.

Soon after his arrival, Devitt's Camp was opened as a TB sanatorium in 1912. Father Mahony provided for the spiritual care of the Catholic patients. He was not content with visiting these isolated and afflicted people merely on appointed days, but it was his joy to spend as many hours with them as he could arrange and comfort them with this priestly ministrations.

The interior of the Church had not been redecorated since it had been built, thirty years before. Father Mahony had it re-frescoed and it was to be thirty-five years before it was done again.
