A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

With the missionary spirit of a true apostle, Father Breckel opened his rectory to the Society of the Divine Word and gave them their first home in the United States. Two priests and three brothers had been persuaded to come to America by Monsignor Anthony Kaul of Lancaster to establish an industrial school and orphanage.

It was he who recommended the "church farm" in Chillisquaque as an ideal site. The Society remained here for a number of years and for a time

rented a home at 127 North Front Street. When it became apparent that legal difficulties would make the transfer of the

"church farm" a problem, the Society moved to Illinois and there flourished extensively.

When Father Breckel was transferred to York, in 1907, the parish numbered 60 families and 289 souls.

Following Father Breckel's time at St. Joe's Milton, Reverend James Barr became the next pastor. Ordained in 1875 by Bishop Shanahan, he came to Milton in 1907. A sickly man, he died in less than four months. Father Edward McClary succeeded him in May 1908. He was ordained in 1902, and like Father Barr, he was sickly. He died at the home of his sister in 1910.
