

From Your Pastor.

I am writing my column on the anniversary of "D Day", remembering the blessing General Eisenhower asked of God upon the great effort to restore civilization to Europe. Now we are engaged in another great battle between good and evil. And I ask your prayers for the success of our efforts to restore reference to the Holy Trinity, to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, present in the sacrament of the Lord's Body and Blood, and in His Consecrated Religious Sisters.

You might not realize the significance of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, on June 16th, but the Evil One does. This coming Friday, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the L.A. THE SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

The Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is a celebration that falls 19 days after Pentecost, on a Friday. The liturgical feast was first celebrated in Rennes, France. The liturgy was approved by the local bishop at the behest of St. John Eudes, who celebrated the Mass at the major seminary in Rennes on August 31, 1670. You'll notice that the first celebration was not situated in the days following Pentecost.

In 1856, Pope Pius IX established the Feast of the Sacred Heart as obligatory for the whole Church, to be celebrated on the Friday after Corpus Christi.

But the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is much older. In the 11th century this devotion found a renewal in the writings of Benedictine and Cistercian monasteries. This expression was given form by Saint Bernard of Clairvaux in the 12th century in his famous poem/prayer "O Sacred Head Surrounded."

O Sacred Head surrounded
By crown of piercing thorn!
O bleeding Head, so wounded,
Reviled and put to scorn!
Death's pallid hue comes o'er Thee,
The glow of life decays,
Yet angel hosts adore Thee
And tremble as they gaze.

I see Thy strength and vigor
All fading in the strife,
And death, with cruel vigor,
Bereaving Thee of life;
O agony and dying!
O love to sinners free!
Jesus, all grace supplying,
O turn Thy face on me!

In this Thy bitter Passion,
Good Shepherd, think. of me,
With Thy most sweet compassion,
Unworthy though I be;
Beneath Thy Cross abiding,
'Forever would I rest,
In Thy dear love confiding,
And wilth Thy presence blest.

The Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated on the Saturday after Corpus Christi. For the 2023 Liturgical Calendar this is Saturday, June 17th, 2023.

As mentioned in last week's bulletin, Perpetual Care of a cemetery simply implies that the church will perform lawn maintenance. At St. Joe's cemetery, we mow weekly (when there is rain), and we trim bi-weekly (when there is rain).

We understand that folks want to honor their forefathers with flowers and ornaments. However, planting a flower on a grave Memorial Day weekend, and then never tending to it causes problems. We do not have the manpower to water and trim.

Placing an ornament such as a solar light is acceptable. However, it should be placed right beside the tombstone, so that the person mowing does not have to get off of the tractor to pull it out and then replace it. We cannot be responsible for ornaments that are placed on or around a tombstone.
