FEAST DAY OF SAINTS PETER & PAUL

Pictured on the front of the bulletin are two of our stained glass windows. The St. Paul window is in memory of Mario Boiardi. St. Paul was considered to be the Apostle to the Gentiles. His conversion from Judaism occurred on his way to Damascus to persecute the followers of Jesus. After his conversion, he preached in the synagogues in Damascus, and for this he was hated by the Jews, and he had to flee the city.

The St. Peter window was a gift given by Rita & John Reich. St. Peter was a simple fisherman of Galilee called Simon, son of John. He is mentioned in the Gospel more than any other apostle. Peter dwelt intermittently in Rome for 25 years. Here, he served as the first Bishop of the church. In the year 67 A.D. under the reign of Nero, he was crucified head down. Two Epistles in the New Testament are attributed to St. Peter.

My dear brothers and sisters, it's hard to think that this will be one of my final messages to you as your bishop. In just a few days, our Diocese will welcome Bishop Timothy Senior as the Twelfth Bishop of Harrisburg, and I will begin a new role as the Bishop Emeritus.



I remember receiving the call in 2014 from the Apostolic Nuncio telling me I was the next Bishop of Harrisburg. It was unexpected, but now, nine years later, it seems that it was only yesterday that I received that phone call. My time as your bishop has certainly flown by.

When I reflect back, there have been many good times and also times when we were challenged. There were times when the path seemed straightforward, but also times when it seemed that we didn't know where the next bend in the path may take us.

Recently, I was asked to reflect back on what I have enjoyed the most as your bishop. As a pastor at heart, meeting the people of the Diocese, meeting with you, and passing on our faith, especially through the celebration of the sacraments, has been one of my greatest joys. As our journey together comes to a close and my retirement draws near, please continue to pray for me and pray for Bishop Senior as we both experience this time of change. As we read in Ecclesiastes, "To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven."

As we enter this season of change, I leave you with one final blessing: May the Lord bless you and keep you. May the Lord let his face shine upon you. May the Lord lift up his countenance to you and give you his peace. And may the blessing of Almighty God, the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit come down on you now and remain with you forever.

May God bless each of you and know that I will continue to keep you in my prayers. Thank you for all your support and love during my time as the Eleventh Bishop of Harrisburg.
