

# From Your Pastor.

This Sunday is a good time to take a look at the concept of 'First Fruits', not in the sense of fruitcake, but rather giving to God the very best God has given to us. Even in secular culture the 'First' is special to us. The first born, the first steps a baby takes, the first words spoken, the first day on the bus going to school, the first date and kiss are easily remembered, the first bike without training wheels, the first flight, the first time to the ocean, the first car and first house all are special firsts. A priest remembers his first Mass and the first Confession and absolution he gave.

St. Paul speaks in Romans of remembering the 'first fruits of the Spirit,' to sustain us in our times of suffering and our sojourn through life to the Kingdom of Heaven. The Jews celebrated the feast of First Fruits during Passover. It is highly likely that the day after the sabbath, Easter Sunday, the day Jesus rose from the dead, was the feast of the First Fruits, as Jesus gave the Father and to us the gift of Himself. At every Mass we give back to God the Father the gift of the first fruit, His Son in the Holy Eucharist.

As grateful Christians we give back to God symbols of our first fruits, our offerings of time, talent, and treasures. Not to come to Mass with a desire to give an offering, our first fruits of a new week, is to sadly fail to understand the parable of the Sower going out to sow, seeking to reap a rich harvest of a hundred-fold. God gives to us that we might give back to Him and share in the joy of giving. For the gift of a thankful generous heart, let us praise the Lord.

Come out and enjoy some fun and learn more about the impact the Library makes on the surrounding community.


