From Your Pastor.

Father Francis Filippelli became pastor of St. Joseph's in June 1967. In November 1967, he was hospitalized, and it was discovered he had cancer. He died in March 1968.

To honor her son, Mrs. Filippelli – Father's housekeeper, established the scholarship to honor an outstanding senior. In the late 1990's, an additional benefactor was added to the award, and it became the Filippelli/Ferlazzo Scholarship.

We have partnered with Sacred Heart Parish, Lewisburg to help support the Immaculate Conception Parish in Lalouere, Haiti. In 2022, St. Joseph, Milton collected \$7,515.00 for this wonderful mission effort. Pictured are students in this Parish School.



The monies are only wired once a year because of the exorbitant fees, and there were delays this year. Hopefully, the

problem was resolved.

Father Junior bears a heavy burden as he is at risk daily. He literally has to sneak around at night on side roads so instigators of violence do not know his actions. He is this parish's main resource for everything temporal and spiritual as gangs and violence have taken over.

Our CCD students were hoping to make Facetime calls and to send letters to the students and teachers. However, Father, the faculty and students cannot risk having contact with someone who has access to Americans. Also the Parishioners speak Haitian Creole and not French as we earlier thought.
