A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

From the June 18th bulletin: The Reverend John A. Mahony was ordained in 1902. He came to Milton from Hanover in 1910. He made his first project cemetery improvement.



The interior of the Church had not been redecorated since it had been built, thirty years before. Father Mahony had it refrescoed and it was to be thirty-five years before it was done again. Although the Church had a bell tower, it never had a church bell and in 1915, Father Mahony installed the present bell which was donated and blessed by the Right Reverend Monsignor J. J. Koch, Vicar General of the Diocese and a former pastor.

Father Mahony was an inspiring leader and under his care the parish flourished spiritually and temporally. The parish was free of debt and the people were harboring images of a parochial school when he was appointed pastor of the St. Joseph's Church in Locust Gap in 1925.
