From Your Pastor.

To understand the depth of the anguish, pain and depression of Elijah and St. Paul over the loss of God's power and glory to make all things right, we need to stop and think of sometime, somewhere, that God seemed to fail to fulfill His promises to answer our prayers. To feel like a failure and abandoned by God was the greatest pain for Jesus on the cross. It has happened to all of us if we are truly following Christ.

But God does give us a sign of His ever-faithful love, sometimes like a 'tiny whispering sound', a still small voice, that we know as quiet as it is, the Lord is with us. This small voice might come to us amid a violent storm in our life. But as we begin to be aware of the Lord, we need to say like Peter "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You on the water." He will say to us, 'Come'

Here is the value of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, come and say to the Lord in the monstrance, "Lord, if it is You, command me to come to You." These words would be good to remember as you come to adoration on Monday into Tuesday.

A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

A history of St. Joseph's Parish would not be complete if it failed to mention two priests who were not assigned to the parish but who lived here and endeared themselves to many in the parish.

When the Federal Penitentiary was opened, Armistice Day, 1932, the Rev. Joseph J. Schweich was appointed Catholic chaplain. He lived at 109 Broadway for the next five and one-half years, and by his friendly manner and kind-hearted nature, he endeared himself to the people of Milton.

Following the death of Father Kennedy, Father Schweich administered the temporalities of the parish assisted by the Rev. Albert J. Hoenninger who came to Milton in October 1933 and remained until January 1934. Father Schweich was transferred to Lewistown in May 1938.

Rev. Francis J. Heltshe succeeded Father Schweich. He served as Catholic chaplain at the Penitentiary and cared for the new flock at Sacred Heart Parish, Lewisburg, and he lived at our rectory for ten years until he was transferred to Lebanon, PA in 1947.

The United States Penitentiary, Lewisburg is a medium-security federal prison for male inmates. An adjacent satellite prison camp houses minimumsecurity male offenders.
