From Your Pastor.

Recalling a 1992 movie, one might not remember much, but the most memorable scene and line from 'A Few Good Men', is from Jack Nicholson as Colonel Nathan R. Jessup, "You can't handle the truth." I have used that even while a Navy Chaplain to the Marines, and I have thought of it many times as I prepared a homily.

To me, the most challenging aspect of being a pastor, a Watchman on the wall, 'Ezekiel 33:7' of being one who listens to the voice of God and does not harden the heart, not hiding the uncomfortable truth to avoid conflict, is that of telling the whole truth of the Gospel and the Magisterium of the Church. As sworn in the court room, "Do you promise to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth, so help you, God?" In today's culture there are sins that we like to hear preached against: the neglect of the environment, social injustice, racism, disrespect for minorities, selfish greedy stewards. But then again there are other sins that society does not want to hear about: sins against Chasity, cohabitation, contraception, abortion, acting on same sex attraction, infidelity in marriage, defending the Church's right to speak freely, protecting children from transgender surgery and more.

Many years ago, at the beginning of my priesthood, a friend said something I have tried to reconsider many times over. He said, "A priest is suppose to afflict the comfortable and to give comfort to the afflicted."

Pray for me, as I pray for you.
