I almost sinned this past week while on the road. I was thinking of this Sunday's Advent lessons, I was tempted to borrow from PennDOT, signs saying prepare to slow down and stop, road construction ahead. I thought it would be a powerful way to stress the message of scripture this Second Sunday of Advent.

"Prepare the way for the Lord. Make straight His paths." Isaiah said more, "Make straight in the wastelands a highway for our God!" *Telling them to lower the mountains and fill in the valleys*. And Peter is telling the whole Church, that is the saved and born-again believers as well as any potential converts, that all should come to repentance.

This week each night at 700pm in all the area parish churches there will be a gathering of priests to hear confessions, give penance and absolution and reconciliation to all who enter into the grace of the Holy Spirit to repent and do penance. This is one of the treasures of the Church, without this sacrament I would have given up and left the Lord's call to follow Him many years ago.
