From Your Pastor.

Do you see what I see? Do you hear what I hear? Do you know what I know? Said the king to people everywhere, listen to what I say, Pray for peace, people everywhere! You might recognize these words from the 1962 Christmas Carol known as "Do You Hear what I Hear?

Written by a former French underground resistance fighter and former Nazi, song writer, Noël Regney and his wife Gloria. October 1962 was a very scarry time during the Cuban Missile Crisis. Many feared the end of the world as we knew it. Noël was commissioned to write a Christmas Song at that time and under fear of the Missile Crisis and by inspiration from his Catholic Faith, this is what he composed. It was released just before Christmas, although it has undergone over 120 new versions. During an interview Noël said he was amazed that people will say they know the song but fail to realize it is a prayer for peace.

Today, over 60ty years later, we are still under the threat of war and evil. But this timely song then is still meaningful today. The child, the child sleeping in the night, He will bring us goodness and light.

May we find the Light of Christ burning brightly at our Holy Christmas Masses and at our adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Let us learn, to let go, be still and silent so that we might see, hear and know how to pray for peace everywhere.

May God Bless us, one and all with Christmas faith, hope, love and joy.
