

From Your Pastor.

Just a month until St. Valentine's Day, see how fast time goes! We are only about 80 days until Easter. Last month I kept thinking, I can't believe the year has passed so fast. Time is a sacred gift from God. Let us remember "It is not how many years a person gets to live, it is what one does with the time God has given to us." So let us pray that we make good use of the days before us in 2024. We begin Ordinary Time, not that any time is ordinary in the Lord.

This Sunday, let us seek to learn from the young prophet Samuel, "Speak Lord, your servant is listening!" Also Psalm 40, "Here I am Lord, I come to do Your will." It is a blessing to have the 24 Hours of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament every Monday into Tuesday. I missed you and my prayer time with the Lord these past two weeks because of the date for Christmas and Solemnity of Mary Mother of God. I have been so blessed today as I sincerely tried to follow the Scripture and to be still, shut up so that the Lord could show up in my heart and do the speaking. It is hard to listen and to be open hearted to what God has to say. But it is worth the effort.

Today, the Lord told me that His Baptism was a life changing event. After 30 years of the quiet, safe life in the home of Mary and Joseph in Nazareth, Jesus came into the public life of confronting Satan and all evil and teaching about the Kingdom of His Father. It was the end of a peaceful life and the beginning of a new life doing the will of the Father.

In my mediation the thought I received was that the death of St. Joseph was very beautiful. There were tears among all three, but there was joy and trust in the Father's will. Joesph told Jesus how proud he was of his son and how he knew that the young man, Jesus, was ready to complete the good work Joesph had carried out from the time of the Annunciation. Jesus learned so much from Joseph and was proud of His *Abba* Joseph. There are many persons in our life that help us to learn how to listen to the voice of God, often it is the voice of our parents. May St. Joseph pray for us that we listen well and do the will of God.

Our handicap restroom installation has made several strides this past week.

Poured concrete has cured. Cement blocks were brought

in. Blocks were laid and now under cover for protection from the elements.

Next step will be dependent upon the weather. Part of the ramp will be removed and then aligned with the bathroom. New concrete will then be poured for the realigned ramp and bathroom.

What you see in the picture is the base (the poured concrete), the cinder block which will not be visible when the project is completed, and the white pipe that passes through to the church basement (and a little bit of snow!)

Fish Dinners Are Right Around The Corner



The first of six fish dinner fundraisers is February 16th. So, we are looking for workers at various positions and various dates. The dinners will continue to be "takeout" because the dining room is used for Mass.

These are our needs:

Wednesday 8:00-10:00, we peel & dice the potatoes, cut the vegetables for the coleslaw and prepare & portion the tartar sauce.

Thursday 8:00-10:00, we thaw the fish and prepare the coleslaw.

Friday 7:30-10:00, we bread the fish, portion the coleslaw and prepare the stewed tomatoes.

Friday 9:30-11:00, we portion & box the cakes.

Friday 12:15-1:30, we bag the rolls.

Friday 11:00-??, we prepare and roast the potatoes.

Dinner crew must arrive by 3:40.

We need line servers, runners (take the food from the kitchen to the CCD hallway), carhops, and <u>most</u> importantly a cleanup crew!

A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

Father Pohl had accumulated the sum of \$14,000 toward the much needed repair of the Church interior, and with the threatening



developments of the Korean War making delay unwise, Father Topper began the work almost immediately. Plaster had fallen from the ceiling and the walls were so badly damaged that the entire interior


had to be replastered. The surfaces were covered with metal lath in October 1950, and the plastering was completed for Christmas. The painting and decorating were entrusted to the *Rambush Decorating Co, New York*, one of the nation's outstanding firms engaged in church decoration. The electrical system was modernized, and thirty-six Rambush light fixtures were installed. A new oil-fired boiler and heating system with recessed radiation were installed by *B. O. Daubert*, *Lewisburg, PA*. The floor in the nave of the Church was covered with rubber tile in blue, grey and red to match the fresco.

The Jasper Wood Products Company, Watsontown fabricated and donated the combed grain oak altar and gradine. They also donated the matching wood for the altar railing, doors, wainscot and other furnishings. When the work was complete, carpenters and others had brought the total expense for church repair to \$25,230. The wood-carved statues of the Madonna and St. Joseph, imported from Italy by Carl Moser, NY, and a few other items, added \$2,180 to the expenditures. The repair of the church interior was completed for Easter Sunday 1951, and the parish had a debt of \$7,000 which was liquidated before the end of the year.

In the fall of 1952, repairs and improvements in the rectory and needed furnishings necessitated the expenditure of \$5,700. At the same time the exterior of the Church and Rectory were painted at a cost \$2,500.
