

FEBRUARY IS BLACK HISTORY MONTH

From Bishop Senior: As we begin the annual commemoration of Black History Month, with our fellow Americans we honor the legacies of African Americans throughout history. Our Diocese, like the Universal Church, is blessed with this same diversity and finds joy in celebrating the unique contributions of African American Catholic life both in its long-standing forms and in its new expressions shaped by African immigrants among us today.

With his in mind, we have shared short bios of several Black Saints (not necessarily American) on our bulletin boards and in the bulletin.



St. Monica, mother of St. Augustine of Hippo and a woman of great faith, lived in North Africa. Through Monica's influence, both her husband and mother-in-law were baptized. Monica had a son named Augustine. In his

youth, Augustine led a disgraceful life. For many years Monica prayed constantly for his conversion, and her prayers were finally answered. With God's help, Augustine turned his life around and became a great bishop, writer and teacher. Her feast day is August 27th.

We try hard to notify folks if Mass venue changes are needed due to inclement weather or construction projects or an emergency.


